### Lon Chaney In "Mr. Wu" Opens At Arcade Thursday

The inscrutable Oriental—elusive of the eye—this is the latest role of Lon Chaney, "man of a thousand faces"—who had literally to learn a new psychology to play his latest part on the screen. This is the mysterious mandarin, Wu, in Metro-Goldwyn-Mayer's new drama of Oriental intrigue and revenge "Mr. Wu," which comes to the Arcade theater Thursday for a three day run.
