TIRED OF LOOKING AT BIRD PICTURES

NEW YORK—Masterpieces of art dealing with bird life, painted and sketched by a famous expert, are buried beneath common paint and wall paper on the walls of John James Audubon's old studio, and it is doubtful whether they can be restored, the mansion along the Hudson river where once lived the ornithologist and artist who died in 1857.
