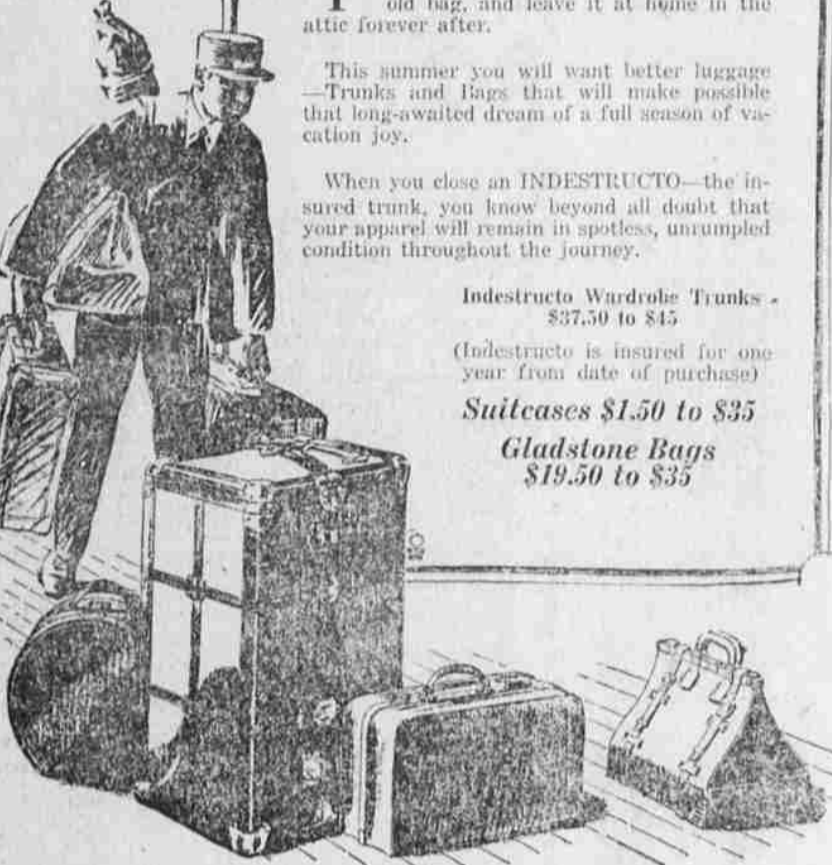

MARKET SLOW IN PORTLAND TODAY

Strawberries 7 Cents a Box—Prospect for An Egg Jump Is Noted

PORTLAND, Ore., July 5 (AP)—Despite plentiful offerings of highest quality Oregon grown fruits and vegetables at seasonably low prices, trade demand on the local produce market seemed rather slow this morning. Trade channels were still lagging under the influence of the long-over holiday spirit incident to the past two days' business inactivity.

A very wide variety of home-grown stocks displayed on the retail market were being offered at attractive prices for best quality stuff.

Excellent Oregon-grown strawberries were in plentiful supply at 7 cents per box, 2 boxes for 20 cents. Raspberries were 10 cents per box and currants 8 cents. Melons and large watermelons are now offered at 2 1/2 cents.

Cherries 15 Cents Oregon-grown cherries, with long stems predominating, were 15 cents per pound. Some varieties of cherries were offered in limited quantities at 20 cents per pound. The market for country dressed meats was quiet due to short killings over the holidays. Receipts were light on the week's opening. Hogs were easier at from 14 to 14 1/2 cents a pound.

Butter and egg prices are unchanged on the local dairy exchange. Egg receipts are lighter with prospects for a slight advance in price.

Quiet Strength Prevailing Note In Wall Street

NEW YORK, July 5 (AP)—Quiet strength characterized today's stock market which moved upward under the leadership of General Motors and General Electric. A few odd spots cropped out here and there, but they were disregarded as points continued to mark up their favorite.

Buying of the bulls centered largely in Southern Pacific and Chicago and Eastern Illinois preferred, both of which attained new 1927 peak prices, and in such high priced issues as Atlantic Coast Line, Delaware and Hudson, Louisville and Nashville, Norfolk and Western and Michigan, all up 2 points or more.

General Motors was bid up to 26 1/2 by early afternoon, representing a gain of 2 1/2 points above Saturday's close and more than 11 points above last week's low.

General Electric ran up over 4 points to 17 1/2, and was followed into new high ground by American Can, Colgate and Alcoa. United Carbide, Manhattan Electrical Supply, glumox company and several others.

The closing was strong. The general list registered to give an impressive exhibition of strength at the session. In a close railroad began to figure more prominently in the picture, especially by Delaware and Hudson and Chicago and Northwestern which went up 2 points. Gains of one or more were made by American Tobacco, C. I. A., American Petroleum, H. I. and American Magnetics. Total sales approximately 1,400,000 shares.

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Farm Pointers

Water requirements of growing livestock are placed at an average of about 10 gallons daily per animal for cattle and horses and one gallon daily for sheep and goats. In warm weather stock on the range should have daily access to water.

In the southern coastal plain, cut-over tobacco lands will re-stock themselves with young tree growth in from three to five years if as many as six seed trees are left to the acre and fire is kept out.

A cow should not be milked before calving unless distention of the udder causes severe pain. Dairy heifers should not calve before they are 24 to 26 months of age. If they are mated they should not calve before they are 20 months of age.

Warehouses and terminal storage facilities should be made adequate and stored farm products given a credit status on a par with other commodities.

Particular care should be used in constructing milk house floors. Concrete is by far the best material for this purpose, as it resists moisture decay and wear. Milk canny should be stable, odorless, and free from bacteria. It should be free from souring and development of bad flavor.

Cows should be fed according to the quantity of milk or butterfat produced. United States dairymen explain, and to do this intelligently daily production must be known.
