Seasoned Portland Veteran Knocked Out in 3rd—Ford, Davis Win

BAKEL, Ore., July 6 (AP)—Tiger Thomas, Philadelphia, won an easy victory over Nails Gorman, Hood River, in the 15-in-round main event on the 15th convention card here last night.

Del Allen, La Grande, surprised fans by knocking out Johnny Trambitas, Portland, in the third round of the six-round semi-final.

Pirpo Ford, La Grande, knocked out Bud Shaver, Baker, in the second round of the second preliminary.

In the second the Portland veteran carried the fight to Allen and ran afoul of the La Grande's heavy steam-should punches. Allen drove Trambitas to the ropes and knocked him out of the ring in the second.

By the time the third round was about half gone, Allen administered the kyro drops.

**Diamond Lake Fish Output Is Heavy**

SALEM, Ore., July 6 (AP)—Fish spawned at Diamond Lake this year averaged from 2 1/2 to 3 pounds says a report to Governor Patterson from Matt Nyekman, superintendent of the state hatchery, and the grade of eggs was better and larger than in previous years. The egg take was about 15,000,000.

The shipping of eggs from Diamond Lake began June 15. The department is holding 6,500,000 eggs at Sheet creek which will be ready to ship until late this month because of the temperature of the water. A million eggs are being hatched at Diamond Lake for distribution in the inland arrangements also have been made for try to be hatched to the lake from the Klamath hatchery. Indications are that there are more fish in Diamond Lake this year than ever before.

Large shipments of rainbow trout eggs are reported from Diamond Lake to the McKenna, Canyon creek, Tulon creek, Ralph creek, Williams, Hood River, Huie Falls and Tualala hatcheries. Rainbow eggs have been shipped from Klamath to the Deep creek hatchery, steelhead eggs from Mohler to the Hood River hatchery, cut throat eggs from Nevada to the Hudson hatchery. Rainbow eggs from Klamath to the Lakeview hatchery and steelhead eggs from Tidewater to the McKenna hatchery.
