Nation-Wide Eradication of Bovine Tuberculosis Expected Soon

The more rapid of federal and state cooperation will make nationwide eradication of bovine tuberculosis an immediate possibility. Control within animal industry should be quick.

INTERVIEW BUDD ON TRUNK PLANS

Building of Rail Extension Will Mean Much to Oregon's Growth

PORTLAND, Ore., July 8 (AP)—"Construction of the extension of the Oregon Trunk south from Bend to Klamath Falls by the Great Northern will bring our line in closer touch with Oregon's development and hereafter we will be much more intimately identified with the affairs of this state."

This statement was made today by Ralph Budd, president of the Great Northern, on his return to Portland from a trip over the proposed route of the Oregon Trunk extension with other officials of his company.

"When the Oregon Trunk extension is completed we will have a line running almost entirely through the state from north to south," said President Budd. "We expect many big developments to result from our extension of railway transportation facilities to the Klamath Falls region. The first step which we will take is to develop natural resources and with transportation we will develop industry. Of course, this timber is the big thing and while there is not now any great demand for timber, it ultimately will be increased."

"The Hammer Brothers construction company is proceeding rapidly with the work of grading and when that is completed track laying will start. It will be approximately six months before the line is finished retaining rights of way delays are a little."

Along logging road which extends for 22 miles south from Bend and which the Great Northern has purchased as its first part of the extension. It will be necessary to reconstruct much of this line.

EMPLOYMENT IN NORTHWEST GOOD

Industrial, Agricultural, Construction Activities Nearing Peak

PORTLAND, July 8 (Special)—Industrial, agricultural and construction activities, except logging and lumbering, are now nearing seasonal peak, giving employment to practically all available men and women in the Pacific northwest, according to the 41 employment letter published here today. Revolving employment conditions west of the Cascades the 41 reports:

Industrial activities have been temporarily slowed down because of Fourth of July holidays. Logging camps began to shut down or contract operations early in June and it is now estimated that not more than 50 per cent of its capacity will actually log during July.

More than 2,000 loggers who were laid off before the Fourth are working. They are waiting for camps to reopen, while hundreds have gone east of the mountains and elsewhere for the harvest or have taken local construction jobs.

The annual Fourth of July closing of sawmills has averaged five days. Sawmill operation continues spotty, and with more or less curtailment of actual production in nearly every district. Agricultural, raising factory, railroad, highway, tourist, mining and industrial activities are at midsummer peak. The number of unemployed is low, but those without work find it difficult to secure jobs suited to their experience. It is equally difficult to secure skilled help promptly for jobs offered. Turnover in all lines is low.

East of the Cascades both logging and lumbering is more nearly normal than in the fir districts, according to the 41 letter. There are now but few skilled woodmen, sawmill or planer men unemployed.

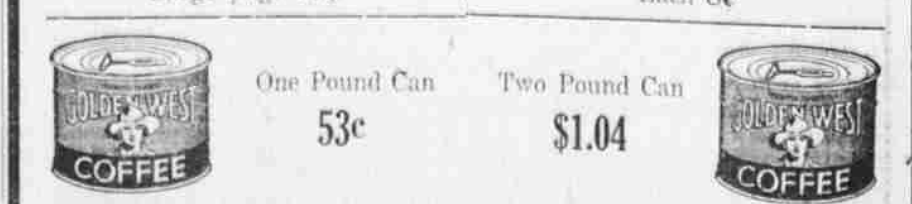
