The actress and Captain MacKintosh were married in February, 1926. When they separated in September, Miss Talmadge said she said "I'm out of love" with her husband but still thought he was "the greatest man she knew."

SEATTLE, July 8 (AP)—Mrs. Howard H. Hartley, wife of the governor of Washington, was injured in an automobile accident 23 miles south of Seattle late last night. She was brought to a hospital here, early today.

At the hospital, it was found that Mrs. Hartley's injuries were confined to a half-inch cut over the right eye, and minor bruises. With Mrs. Hartley in the automobile at the time of the accident were Governor Hartley, their daughter, Mary, and the Rev. and Mrs. L. O. Rogers, of Buffalo, N. Y. Mrs. Rogers is a sister of the governor. None of the occupants of the machine except Mrs. Hartley were injured. A state highway policeman was driving the car, accepted by the governor and his party, who were en route from Seattle to Olympia.
