Sid Terris Has Chance To Win Title If He Continues His Present Pace

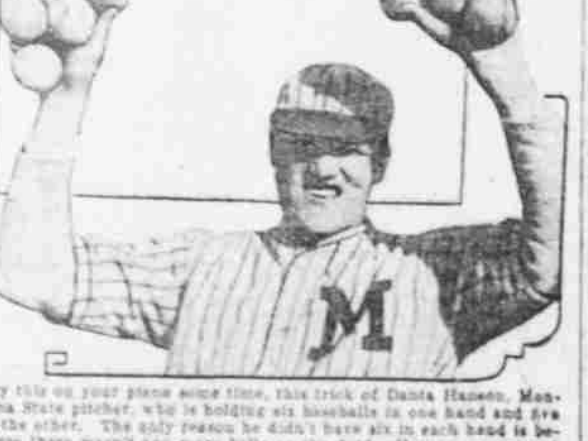
