BOBBY BACK IN RACE WITH A 71

Wild Bill Mehlhorn, However, Leading Jones on St. Andrews Course

SAINT ANDREW'S, Scotland, July 12 (AP)—Eight Americans led by Bill Mehlhorn, with 146, Bobby Jones, 147, and Joe Kirkwood, 148, are certain of qualification in the British open championship. Bill Mehlhorn returned another 71 today for an aggregate of 146 to nose Jones out of the leading American position by a single stroke. Mehlhorn now aggregate held for only a little while, however, for the British amateur star, Cyril Tolley, came in with a 71 for a total of 146, as the lowest figure.

Close on Tolley's heels were C. A. Whitcombe, the British professional with 145, and the Frenchman, Rene Godas, with 147.

The field in the championship fight will number 128 players, including all the Charles Mayer, of Fishkill, N. Y., and Roger Wetherill, the British star, both with 141, failed to qualify.

SAINT ANDREW'S, Scotland, July 12 (AP)—Bobby Jones shot a fine 71 today in his second qualifying round in defense of the British open golf championship.

This equaled the lowest card turned in for the opening round yesterday. Jones' card of 71 today and 75 yesterday gave him a total of 147 for the 36-hole qualifying play.

Bill Mehlhorn soon after turned in a 146 for the two days play, which was the leading American qualifying score. Mehlhorn shot a 73 yesterday and another 73 today.

Jim Barnes, New Rochelle, N. Y., had 153 for his two days play, but the young amateur, Edwin Halsey, also of the United States, appeared eliminated with a 164.

A drizzling rain blew in from the North Sea all morning and the early totals on both qualifying courses were high. The first half dozen cards all being 80 or over. Jim Barnes being the lone exception with a 79.

Harry Vardon, the British veteran took a 79 today, giving him a total of 158.

Len Nettieford, Australian amateur champion, took a 75, turning in a total of 155.

Walter Knott, of Palma Ceta, Fla., took a 75, which gave him a total of 155.

Tom Stevens, of Los Angeles, who took a 78 yesterday, needed 52 today, giving him a total of 130.

Jack Redmond, of New York, shot a better game today, with 75. His 87 yesterday made his total 162.

PLAY A GOLF MARATHON

ATLANTON, Ark. (AP)—Two Atlanton golfers lay claim to the marathon golf record of the central states by virtue of 130 holes played consecutively in one day recently over the Bellevue Country club course here. They did it in 13 hours and 55 minutes.

"Bud" Armstrong, 23, and Peter Pedrosa, 46, were the players. They started at 7 a. m. and continued through the grind. Four other rounds were forced to give up. Pedrosa averaged 185.5 strokes per 18 holes and Armstrong 115.7.

Bill Barrett's daring thievery in the ninth won for the Chicago White Sox against Boston, 7 to 6. With the scores tied in the final inning Barrett singled, stole second, went to third when the catcher's throw rolled to the outfield and came home white flagged the ball.

The Yankees drubbed the Detroit Tigers, 5 to 1, in the last of the six games.

The Athletics made it 7 to 6 over St. Louis.

St. Louis Gains
There was little activity in the National league. St. Louis gained half a game on the Cubs and Pirates, who were idle. Grover Cleveland Alexander had a great day against Philadelphia, holding him to one run in four hits and white-washing him 7 to 0.

The league-leading Chicago Cubs were rained out at Boston. Other teams were not scheduled.

WILLS, PAULINO TO ENTER RING TOMORROW EVE

NEW YORK, July 12 (AP)— Hoping to regain some of the prestige he lost last October by his decisive beating at the hands of Jack Sharkey, Harry Wills will climb into the ring at Enbetta Field tomorrow night for a 15-round contest with Paulino Uzcudun, the Spanish woodchopper.

The battle marks the first of the three big heavyweight attractions of the summer, but unlike the Dempsey-Sharkey elimination contest next week and the championship tilt in September, it holds little in store for either participant.

Wills past his prime, and Uzcudun dropped from consideration recently by Tex Rickard, figure to share in the receipts on a percentage basis, as Humbert Fogarty, the promoter, did not care to risk guaranteeing in the face of the Dempsey knockout attempt.

Wills is something of a favorite. The giant Harlem negro says his small hands, which often gave him trouble, have been greatly improved by a 9 months layoff from ring activity.

PORTLAND, Ore., July 12 (AP)—The state game commission has decided to establish a cold storage room for fish used in feeding young trout at the hatcheries near Eugene at the plant of the Eugene Fruit Growers' association.
