Pacific Coast Managers Still Clout The Ball

SAN FRANCISCO (AP)—Most of those who go up come back to the Pacific coast managers in the Pacific Coast League. But there are four club managers in the Pacific Coast League to whom Father Time seems to have bestowed in vain. All are nearing the 40-year mark, yet all have occasional hitting positions at which they once starred in the majors.

The quartet includes Harry Hooper of the San Francisco Mission, Marty Krug, Los Angeles; Ernie Johnson, Portland, and Oscar Vitt, Hollywood. Hooper and Krug acknowledge 35 years, but instead of looking forward to retirement they look only for more base hits. Hooper was with the Boston Red Sox and Chicago White Sox 17 years. He plays outfield quite regularly, stock-taking over the club this year.

Krug, once a mainstay of the Chicago Cubs, holds down third base when the necessity arises, as it does rather often. The fiery little Portland leader, Johnson, was a regular catcher at second base part of last season. He has appeared on the field a number of times this year. Always a dependable hitter, his base knocks continue to come as timely as when he performed in the uniform of the Chicago White Sox.

Vitt, like Johnson, answers to 37 years in the census taking. He used to play third for the Boston Red Sox and still guards the "hot corner" for Hollywood in emergency cases. Of late his activities have been confined mostly to pinch hitting.

LONG BOLT SCHEDULED
BATTLE MOUNTAIN, Nev., (AP)—A 25-round bout, the longest boxing contest in Nevada since 1910, will be fought at Battle Mountain next Labor Day between Sidney White and George Spencer, San Francisco featherweights. Records do not show a longer scheduled fight since the July 4th, 1910 when Jim Jeffries made an unsuccessful comeback attempt for Jack Johnson's heavyweight title. It was billed for 45 rounds. Some 20 years ago, Nevada was a mecca for long distance boxing. Battling Nelson and Joe Gunn fought 42 rounds here for the lightweight crown. Of late years, numerous 25-round matches have been held.

ASKS AMERICANS TO REMEMBER HER

Queen Marie of Rumania Issues Plea Through Associated Press
BUCHAREST, Rumania, July 27 (AP)—A plea to the people of America not to forget her in her sorrow was made by Queen Marie when she requested the correspondent at Comstock palace while King Ferdinand lay dead in an adjoining room. She spoke in tearful tones of her husband, how he would have liked before he died to have seen the former Crown Princess Marie, and characterized as "truly false" words of her critics and advisers that she was an ambitious woman who wanted to be queen after the king's death.

"Death has torn my heart and seared my soul," she said. "It has taken from me my dear husband and the greatest and most dutiful of kings. It reduced me from a reigning queen to a lonely widow. I shall sit isolated and alone in this little room to hear the news which God has thrust upon me. Let not the people of America forget me in my sorrow. Let the women, especially, give me their sisterly love and consolation. I am only a widow now, my throne is gone. I need the support of my dear American friends to bear the slings and arrows which even in death are directed against me by the outside world."

Like Mother Superior.
With a huge crucifix resting on the wall just above her head, and with face enveloped in a deep black veil collected by a mantle of pure white, which gave her features a far greater beauty and spirituality than any leveled crown Marie resembled a mother superior in a convent more than a queen. Her words, spoken from the depths of her soul and at times broken by convulsive sobs, were accentuated in their solemnity and pathos by the atmosphere of death which pervaded the palace.

Probably no interview was ever given in a more dramatic or touching setting. Only the muffled shifting of presents' footsteps passing the king's coffin in the adjacent death chamber could be heard. Burning incense and flickering candles cast an eerie pall over the room. One could not escape a sense of awe as he sat between the dead king and the living queen. At her side were 3

Had I succeeded in succeeding him upon his death as absolute ruler of Rumania, I need only have asked him and his choice would have been supreme. But as a matter of fact we never once discussed the question in spite of the fact that from time to time various persons and political groups urged me. Instantly to become regent. "Those who think evil things of me say I dislike my daughter-in-law, Helen (Carol's wife) that I am jealous of her; that I begrudge little Michael inheriting the best right to the throne. These accusations are heartlessly false. I love Helen and her child with all my heart. They have been deserted by their husband and father. Shall I forsake them in this solemn, trying hour when Michael is about to ascend the throne? No. A queen's heart has greater love than that."
