SALEM, Ore., July 27 (AP)—At a meeting of the state banking board here yesterday, no mention was made of the report that Kenneth C. Bramwell is to resign as state superintendent of banks and that Ben W. Orent is to be appointed in his place.

The board yesterday approved the selection of Oscar A. Carlson, of Portland, and Edmund T. Wray, of Albany, as state bank examiners. They were recommended by Bramwell. Until recently Wray was with the Albany State bank and Carlson was formerly with the federal reserve bank.
