ENGLISH MERMAN SWIMS CHANNEL

Lands Near Dover This Morning—Mrs. Corson Plans New Attempt

DOVER, Eng., Aug. 5 (AP)—E. H. Temme, English swimmer, succeeded today in the first attempt of the season to swim the English channel. Starting off from Cape Gris Nez at 12:45, without this morning Temme landed 100 miles west of Dover.

Mrs. Clemington (Miss Gladys) Corson, of New York, who had just because the second woman to swim the channel, and who has been training for another crossing will attempt the last stage of Temme's swim.

Coliseum Club To Try To Halt Heavyweight Go

CHICAGO, Aug. 5 (AP)—The Chicago Coliseum club, headed by B. E. Clements, announced through Ralph Rosen, its chief counsel, today, that it intended to start court action to prevent Jack Dempsey leaving "Gene" Tunney here next month for the heavyweight championship.

Dempsey's statement pointed out that Dempsey in March, 1924, had contracted to box Harry Wills under Clements' promotion, and served in fight no one else in the interim. Rosen obtained an injunction in an Indiana court prohibiting Dempsey from fighting Tunney at Philadelphia but the decision was not recognized in Pennsylvania.

Advanced notice of the intention of the Coliseum club was given, Rosen said, because "we don't wish to be placed in the position in the court actions which are to be brought, of opening the way for a defense upon the theory that the public whose interests and rights are always to be given first consideration was not advised of the true state of affairs in time to prevent financial loss."

Asserted his client expended very large sums of money in promoting the Dempsey-Wills meeting which failed to materialize.

"Now Dempsey is planning a further violation of our rights and we and those who assisted in former violations have the temerity to do so in our own jurisdiction," said Rosen's lengthy typewritten statement.
