## Yellow Likely To Dominate In Fashion Shows

PARIS (AP)—The "yellow period" which has threatened for several months, is expected to become a certainty this fall, dressmakers forecast.

Yellow will be one of the smartest evening shades of the season, designers believe, although most of them are still waiting for the post-bee contest before launching more than a few yellow models.

Yellow is one of the prettiest shades for velvet, and dressmaker says, the house shows a fragile evening dress in pale saffron yellow, and several models of banana yellow. Chanel is showing several yellow tulle frocks.

No matter what the innovations, however, beige continues to be important among fall and winter colors. The prevalence of brown and the steady popularity of black, which which beige combines successfully, may be responsible for the long return beige has had.

At least one of the dressmaking houses shows beige almost exclusively for daytime and sport wear. There is hardly an important collection which does not recognize the ready value of natural and light tan tones.

One new shade for autumn is a gray-olive that which one dressmaker calls Lava Green. This house uses it largely as a substitute for beige. Young men to green than to gray, the new that is one of several soft shades of green in vogue. For evening almost green is still in evidence and a shade of green that is almost black is used by some designers for street costumes.

While you continue to try new glasses you may be letting some disease of the eye get beyond control. You may be injuring your eyes, straining them, when they should have rest or perhaps medical attention. Indeed, you may be neglecting some systemic disease of which the eye symptoms are warnings. Many eye symptoms are really symptoms of general disease as well as disease of the eyes.

When your glasses are not satisfactory go to a physician-oculist and get a good thorough physical examination and find out how much of your trouble is from the eyes, how much from wrong use of your eyes or from the presence of disease in your body that may

factor the eye. If a new pair of glasses is needed he will be able to tell you. If new glasses will not be satisfactory he will tell you that as well.

## MENUS

BREAKFAST—Raspberries and cream, puffy-toasted cereal, soft-boiled eggs, hot and cold milk, milk, coffee.

LUNCHEON—Baked rice and green peas, graham bread, gooseberry jam, fresh fruit in custard, milk, tea.

DINNER—Baked lamb chops with mushroom sauce, baked potatoes, lima beans in cream, tomato and cucumber salad, blueberry cup pudding, milk, coffee.

Baked lamb chops are delicious and simple. This is an ideal way to make one chop "do" for each person. They can be used for a company luncheon or breakfast for "something different."

Baked Lamb Chops  
Four lamb chops, 1 cup finely chopped onion, 1 tablespoon cream, 1 egg yolk, 1/2 teaspoon salt, 1 teaspoon pepper.

Put seal through fine knife of food chopper two or three times and then force through a fine colander. Season with salt and pepper, add cream and egg yolk and mix thoroughly, using a fork. Trim chops and broil on one side for four minutes. Put into a buttered casserole, uncooked side down and cover the cooked side with the seal mixture. Cover closely and bake 20 minutes in a hot oven. No water is put into the casserole. Serve on triangles of hot bread and pour over mushroom sauce.

Mushroom Sauce  
One cup broken fresh mushrooms, 3 tablespoons butter, 1 teaspoon onion juice, 1/2 teaspoon salt, 2 tablespoons flour, 1 cup milk.

Remove stems, peel caps and break into small pieces. There should be one cup. Melt butter in sauce pan, add mushrooms and sprinkle with onion juice, salt and pepper. Cover and cook five minutes. Remove cover and brown butter. Stir over flour and mix with a fork until thoroughly blended. When mixture is smooth slowly add milk, stirring constantly. Bring to the boiling point and pour over chops as soon as possible.

CORRECTLY FITTED GLASSES OF LITTLE VALUE IF YOU CONTINUE TO OVERWORK YOUR EYES

Morning-glory Is One of Major Pests

WASHINGTON STATE COLLEGE, Pullman, Aug. 11 (AP)—Evaluation of the wild morning-glory or bindweed on Washington farms is one of the most serious problems facing agriculturists, according to a bulletin, "The Bindweed," compiled by E. G. Schafer, of the college of agriculture.

"Although there seems to be no easy method by which eradication can be accomplished at a reasonable cost and with satisfactory results, several methods, one supplementing the others have been used in various sections with fair success," Professor Schafer says.

"Clean cultivation, to be effective, must be so frequent that leaf development will be entirely prevented throughout the growing period. Continued growth without leaf development exhausts the food supply stored in the roots and eventually the plant dies of starvation."

"Sodium chloride or common salt if applied in sufficient quantities will prevent growth and destroy the weed. The amount of salt necessary has been estimated at 10 to 15 pounds an acre. However, salt produces a detrimental physical condition in the soil and an alkali problem has been reported as a result of its application. Also, a commercial product containing arsenic, known as K. M. G., has greatly weakened the bindweed when used as a spray early in August."
