Rin-Tin-Tin Triumphs In New Film

The latest Rin-Tin-Tin picture, "Hills of Kentucky," a Warner Bros. production, which comes to the colonial theater on Sunday for a run of two days, deals with a film Grass legend of a dog known as the Grey Ghost.
