GIRLS WALK OUT; JUDGE BACKS 'EM

El Retiro County School for Homeless Will Be Investigated

LOS ANGELES, Aug. 12 (AP)—Twenty-six girl wards of the juvenile court who yesterday stormed their way out of the El Retiro county school for homeless girls at San Fernando today were being sheltered in juvenile hall pending an investigation of "existing conditions" at El Retiro. They were under the protection of Miss Jean Schmitt, acting referee of juvenile court, who backed up their ultimatum that they would not return to the school under the rigid discipline established by a new administration. The girls, most of whom walked 18 miles under the summer sun from the school to the city, declared their rebellion was caused by the loss of self-government and its replacement by rigid reform school discipline. A boy Miss Anna Hutzschel, superintendent, was dismissed and her place taken by Mrs. Rosemary Groot. The change of management was made last Saturday by members of a juvenile court committee. Miss Schmitt declared the walkout of the girls brought her first knowledge of the change.

Plans Investigation
 Miss Schmitt said she would not require the girls to return under the "existing conditions" and several others connected with the juvenile probation department made reference to "conditions" although declining to explain themselves. It was determined, however, that an exhaustive investigation of the school has been ordered by the juvenile probation department.

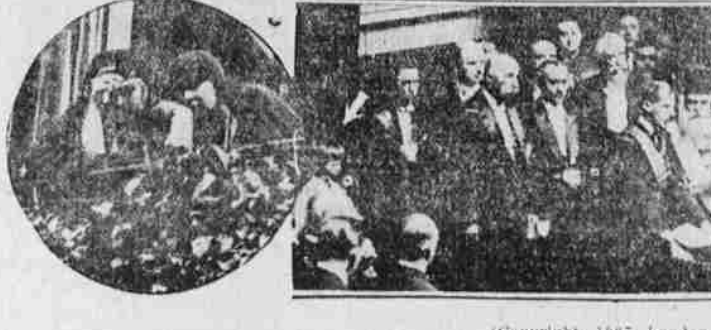
