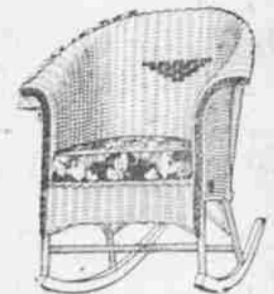

Canoe Trip Down Rogue Ends When Craft Hits Rock

GRANTS PASS, Ore., Aug. 13 (AP)—The trip of Earl Emley, vacation picture man, to Cold Beach, boat down Rogue river ended temporarily Saturday when the craft struck a rock at Eastern Bar on the lower river and went down almost immediately. The boat was being piloted by Cloud Gordon, experienced river man who took Earl Emley to the mouth of the Rogue a year ago. Emley had planned to take a picture of the Rogue river.

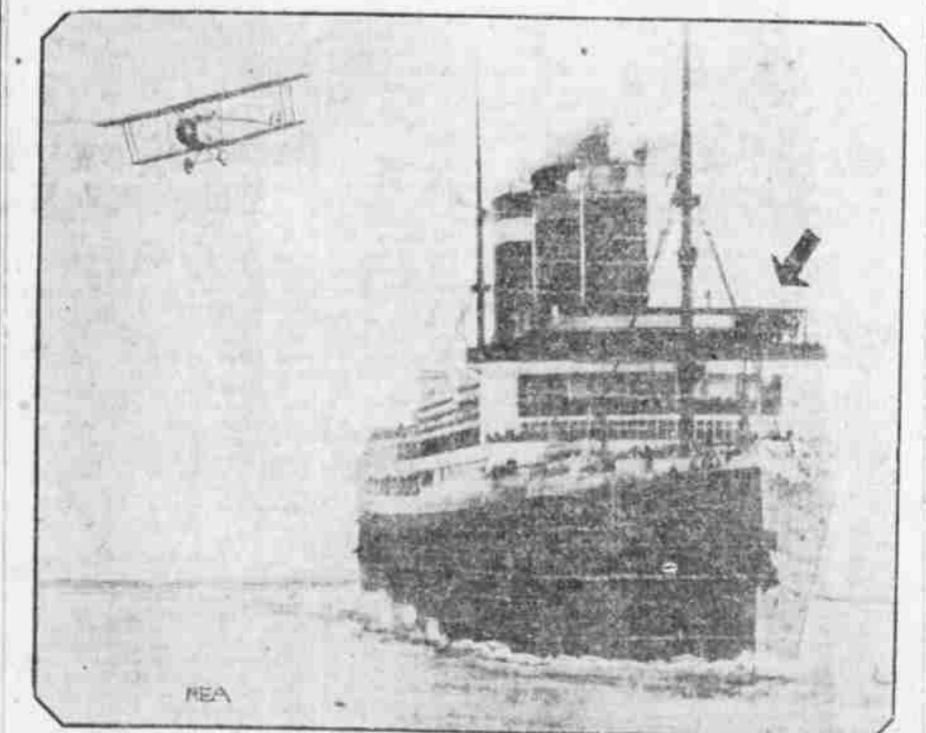
The camera and some of the equipment was saved, although Mr. Emley does not yet know if the films, which he had already taken were ruined. Emley and Gordon started down the river Thursday afternoon. When the accident occurred, which ended their trip, they were seven miles below Alameda or about 10 miles from their starting point. Finding of an automobile tire and rubber container for gas many miles below the scene of the accident gave the two reports Saturday night that the pair might have been drowned. The two returned to Grants Pass today.

Following the accident the boat was raised and repaired and the remainder of the trip to the mouth was made in 14 hours, using an outboard motor. Several films were lost. Sacco Breaks His Fast on 30th Day

BOSTON, Aug. 13 (AP)—Nicola Sacco broke his fast today after starting upon the thirtieth day of his hunger strike by refusing breakfast. During the forenoon he took a quart of beef broth. Monmouth Arthur D. Hill, chief counsel for Sacco and Bartolomeo Vanzetti, completed the final steps necessary before the full bench of the state supreme court considers Sacco's appeal in the case tomorrow. Hill, the foreman filed in the supreme court a lengthy bill of exceptions to the refusal of Judge Sanderson of that court to grant a writ of error.

CO-OP UNITS AN AID TO FARMERS

Secretary Jardine Sees Organization as Agriculture's Best Bet

WASHINGTON, Aug. 13 (AP)—Extensive organization of cooperative units among farmers, creation of a federal farm board and establishment of a fund to assist in carrying surplus crops from season to season is viewed by Secretary Jardine as the "most effective means of improving the troubled agricultural situation."

The plan was outlined by the secretary in an article written for the current issue of the Farm Journal, a Philadelphia publication.

Two avenues of approach were suggested: central of surplus due primarily to weather conditions and a better adjustment of production to the requirements of the market.

In handling surpluses, Mr. Jardine said, much could be accomplished through "community stabilization" corporations operated by the farmers, the essential function of which would be to take off the market temporarily with amounts of a commodity as would prevent the price from falling to a ruinously low level. These corporations, he said, should be guided by the advice of a federal board.

Adjustment of production was explained to mean "adjustment in kind, quantity and amount," which Mr. Jardine asserted, called for complete information on supply and demand, both at home and abroad and for reliable data on regional production problems.

Federal Farm Board

The federal farm board, he said, should be selected on a basis of special fitness for the work involved. Its duties should include formulation of plans and policies for handling surpluses, assistance to the farmer in establishing clearing house associations for the marketing of perishables and administration of the projected fund.

Secretary Jardine emphasized his belief that the plan would not put the government into the business of buying and selling farm products and that it was in no sense a scheme of price fixing.
