MENUS

By Sister Mary
BREAKFAST—Crisped cantaloupe, rolled oats, cereal potato omelet, cross, oven toast, milk, coffee.

LUNCHEON—Baked eggplant, hearts of lettuce with French dressing, Boston brown bread, peach preserves, cream, milk, tea.

DINNER—Broiled fish, mushroom sauce, sliced potatoes, stewed okra, apricot-sherbet, plain cake, milk, coffee.

We are prone to think of Bavarians as elaborate, busy doers but in reality they are very easy to make and most simple. Small children and invalids may usually be served a Bavarian cream just as they may have a simple ice cream. The base for Bavarians is a plain meringue into which whipped cream is folded and the whole then turned into a mold to chill and become firm.

Baked Eggplant
 One small eggplant, 1 1/2 teaspoons salt, 1 green pepper, 2 tablespoons butter, 1/2 cup grated cheese, 1/2 teaspoon pepper, soft stale bread crumbs.

Wash eggplant and cut in slices about 1/2 inch thick. Sprinkle each slice with salt and let stand under a weight for one hour. Place slices of eggplant in a sauce pan, cover with boiling water and cook until tender but not mushy. Drain and chop eggplant in small pieces. Remove seeds and white pith from pepper and chop flesh very fine. Put a layer of eggplant into a well buttered baking dish, sprinkle lightly with salt, pepper, minced green pepper, sliced eggplant, cheese and bits of butter. Continue layer from layer of vegetables, seasonings, crumbs and cheese until all is used. The last layer should be of crumbs. Bake 35 minutes in a hot oven and serve from the baking dish.

PRINCE WILHELM BECOMES 'TUCHMAJOR'
 BERLIN (AP)—Prince Wilhelm, oldest son of the former German crown prince, is now 'Tuchmajer.'

This means that he is a member in charge of the freshmen in the exclusive fraternity "Bonner Tuchmajer," of which the Hohenzollerns have been members since its founding 100 years ago.

Prince Wilhelm became a member on July 4. He has been studying at Bonn for the past year. One of the things that a member of the "Tuchmajer" fraternity must learn to do is to fight the customary student duel. If the prince, when his opponent slashes his face, he is thrown out of the fraternity.

The young prince has been placed in charge of the freshmen who have not fought their first duel. Under the rules of the fraternity they must obey him implicitly.

Prince Wilhelm's prodding appointment came during the recent fortieth anniversary exercises of the fraternity, when his father and his uncle, the grand duke of Mecklenburg, were among the 170 alumni in attendance.

Farm Pointers

Insects spread plant diseases. The cucumber aphid after feeding on a plant infected with mosaic disease, can transmit the infection to a healthy plant by feeding on it no longer than five minutes. Experiments have shown that a small number of these insects can produce mosaic as promptly and abundantly as a greater number.

The common intestinal roundworm, one of the most injurious parasites infesting the pig, can be controlled by changing hogs every year or two to fresh ground. The surface of the old lot should be plowed under, a crop planted and a new, firm surface allowed to form before hogs are returned. The common type of mud wallow usually becomes a source of the disease.

Weeds in and around the garden harbor both insects and disease, particularly if the weeds are related to the cultivated plants. Red spider plant flies and other insects invade the garden from neighboring wood borders. Cabbage pests live on wild mustard, shepherd's

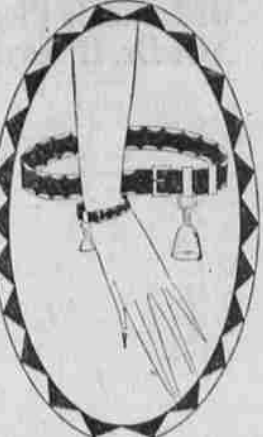
