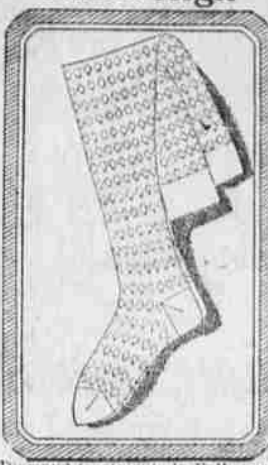

MENUS

By SISTER MARY Breakfast—Grape fruit, broiled fish, potato cakes, eye muffins, milk, coffee.

Luncheon—Cold boiled tongue in aspic, potato salad, corn muffins, blackberries and cream, plain cookies, milk, tea.

Dinner—Vegetable plate, watermelon salad, caramel custard, milk coffee.

If this dinner menu the protein-rich dish is found in the dessert. Often a poached egg is served on a bed of spinach or any creamed vegetable on toast but for this "plate" the addition of the egg is unnecessary. When planning a vegetable dinner always choose vegetables of contrasting color and arrange them attractively.

Cold Boiled Tongue in Aspic Two tablespoons granulated gelatin, one-half cup cold water, two cups boiling water, two bouillon cubes, two tablespoons minced onion, two tablespoons minced celery, one tablespoon minced parsley, one-half teaspoon salt, few grains pepper, one cup diced cold boiled tongue, one head celery.

Soften gelatin in cold water for five minutes and dissolve bouillon cubes in boiling water. Add carrot, onion, parsley, celery and salt to dissolved bouillon cubes, cover closely and simmer 20 minutes. Tongue from fry and stir in softened gelatin. Strain through wire and then through cheesecloth. Place a spoonful of the aspic in the bottom of each individual mold. It will stiffen very quickly. On this put a slice of crisp celery. Cover with a thin layer of aspic and a layer of diced tongue. Continue layer for layer of aspic, celery and meat until all is used. Put on ice for several hours to chill and become firm. Turned on a bed of lettuce hearts and celery curls.

To unbind wrap each cup in a towel wrung out of hot water. Invert and the aspic will slip out easily. This is an excellent way to use up the end of a tongue that is too small for slicing.
