OPPOSE IRRIGATION

PORTLAND, Ore., Aug. 15 (AP)—The Gilliam-Wheeler counties Pomona grants, in resolutions adopted July 30 and received yesterday by the Portland chamber of commerce, went on record as opposing the Columbia basin irrigation project, contending that the two million acres it would open to farming would compete with land already suffering from overproduction.

Another resolution, threatening court action to restrain collection of taxes on agricultural and grazing land if a state income tax is not enacted.
