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Michigan Awakens To Pine Depletion

LANSING, Mich. (AP)—Awakened to the fact that its famous pine forests are almost depleted, Michigan has taken steps to prevent the complete destruction of its white and Norway pine timber.

State foresters have found a natural stand of pine near the center of the state, covering an area, and this tract with 8,000 acres surrounding it will be purchased and dedicated as a permanent forest preserve and game refuge.

A few decades ago hundreds of thousands of Michigan acres were covered with lofty pines. Vast stretches of former pine lands now produce nothing but buckwalter trees. The soil has defied attempts at reforestation.
