Preparations are being steadily pushed for the Labor Day celebration fight card which will be held here Sept. 2 with Benny Wolfe, of Philadelphia, and Deemer Allen La Grande, in the main event.

The girls who are entered in the Labor Day queen contest are selling both dance tickets and exchange tickets for the fight. Those who purchase exchange tickets from the girls must exchange them at either the Imperial or Cornet billiard parlors in order to secure exchange tickets.

Monday afternoon at two o'clock the fighters will work out next to the La Grande barber shop on West street. A ring has been erected there and there is room for a number of spectators. All fighters, however, including Wolfe, are scheduled to work out. Wolfe will not arrive here from Philadelphia, his temporary headquarters, until three days before the fight.
