MENUS
By Sister Mary
DINNER—Fried peas, cream sauce, fried apples, crisp toast, minestrone, milk, coffee.
LUNCHEON—Baked sweet corn, bearded tomatoes, rice, tuna, cottage cheese, currant jam, milk, tea.
DINNER—Hors d'oeuvres of eggs and beet, broiled veal sweet-

bread, creamed peas, fried summer squash, peaches in ambrosia, milk, coffee.
These are ideal hot weather menus. They are seasonable, well balanced and nourishing. No salad is planned for the evening meal but an "appetizer" is used instead. This little trick of varying menus is well worth keeping in mind. There are innumerable combinations to be used that will add to the value of the dinner.

Baked Sweet Corn
One cup corn cut from cob, 1 teaspoon sugar, 1/2 teaspoon salt, 1/2 teaspoon pepper, 2 tablespoons flour, 1 cup milk, 4 eggs.

To cut corn from cob score down through the center of each row of kernels. Cut off the tops of the kernels with a sharp knife. With the blunt edge of the knife scrape out the milk and heart. Mix and stir flour, milk, sugar and pepper over corn. Stir with a fork until thoroughly blended. Add milk and yolks of eggs well beaten. Beat whites of eggs until stiff and dry. Fold into first mixture and turn into a well-buttered baking dish. Bake 30 minutes in a moderate oven. Serve at once. When firm to the touch the dish is done.

Blood Tests To Determine Fate Of Baby Girl, 3

OMAHA, Neb., Aug. 26 (AP)—Rachel was restored to Peter John and his wife, Gypsies, this afternoon, when Dr. A. P. Condon announced that blood tests showed positively that she was their child. The tests had been taken on agreement of the gypsies and county authorities at Oakland, Neb., that the results should be final.

OAKLAND, Neb., Aug. 26 (AP)—The future of a golden haired baby girl today hinged on the outcome of a blood test chosen to determine whether the three-year-old child really is a gypsy princess or perhaps the kidnapped daughter of other parents who somewhere are seeking her.

The blood test to decide the child's gypsy parentage was decided upon by the authorities after they had taken the child from a swarthy band whose king and queen claimed her as their own. The instant pleading of the gypsy mother, known as Annie Johns, led the authorities to adopt the blood test as their method
