FOREIGN TRADE

The American foreign trade balance is no longer of much importance, it is shown in a report of the department of commerce. It is the "invisible balance" that counts.

Last year there was a favorable merchandise balance, reckoned in the usual way, of \$377,000,000. That was smaller than it had been in recent years, yet was a very considerable sum. But it was equalled by our own "gifts to foreigners in immigrant remittances and charities." It was canceled twice over by our tourist payments to foreigners for travel services, and three times over by our new loans to foreigners and other foreign investments.

To give some definite figures: American tourists are estimated to have spent about \$700,000,000 in foreign countries, and there were \$250,000,000 of foreign investments of other kinds.

Herein is seen the answer to the oft-repeated question, "How are our foreign debtors ever going to repay their debts?" When they sell to almost as much as we sell them, and when we wipe out that favorable difference in gifts, and then spend many hundred millions in their countries on travel expenses, invest billions there, and give them all the credit they need to keep going and put their industries on a profitable basis, the situation is no longer one-sided. They acquire considerable of the wisdom that is pay.

Meanwhile our own people cease to regard trade balances as fetiches, and lose their old fear of buying abroad things that they need and want, and learn that nations grow prosperous by dealing with each other—not shunning each other.
