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AT THE THEATERS

Meighan Here In "We're All Gamblers"

Here is "Thomas Meighan in a new type of role—two new types in fact. No Meighan vehicle in recent years has been crowded with so much action. "We're All Gamblers" is the name of the production. It was directed for Paramount by James Cruze, maker of "The Covered Wagon" and "Old London" and it is playing at the star theater today and Wednesday.

It's a great story. It shows the star as a youngster at the start—a wolf on a New York East River dock who is picked up by a policeman and taken in by a kindly woman as her son. By the time he reaches adulthood he is a contender for the heavyweight championship, a celebrity who attracts the interest of an aristocratic woman. An automobile injury prevents him from winning the title and he eventually becomes the proprietor of a night club. The story shows of the fight, an auto accident and East Side life are tense and exciting. This night club's New Year celebration later brings about a thrilling climax.

Supporting Mr. Meighan is a brilliant beauty from Vienna, Marietta Miller. She has appeared in only one American picture before this, but her future is assured. That dear old lady, Gertrude Claire, the Grandmother in "The Goose and the Gander" again charms to the film.

The screen play by Hope Loring is based on Sidney Howard's stage play "Lucky Sam McCarver." "Don't Miss It!"

Beery and Hatton a Riot in Comedy

They've gone and done it again. The unbreakable laugh-provokers—Wallace Beery and Raymond Hatton.

In fact, they've stepped out and surpassed their two previous efforts by a wide margin.

"Pardon, Say My Child" the third of the Beery-Hatton pictures, looks as though it was destined to go down in film history as one of the greatest comedies of 1927. It will surely rank among the foremost farces of all time.

What they did in the uniforms of the army in "Behind the Front" and the navy in "The Navy New" was but a foretaste of the riot they cause in the bins of the fire fighters.

It's doubtful if anyone emerged from the Academy theater yesterday where the new Beery-Hatton vehicle opened for a three day run, without aching sides.

When these two comedy stars first appeared together in "Behind the Front" they were a sensation. In "We're in the Navy Now" they took a stride forward, but in "Pardon, Say My Child" their team work seems to have ripened by experience. They have attained something so outstanding that it would scarcely be possible for them to surpass it.

Beery and Hatton again appear in spick uniforms, without which it would be difficult to picture them, and the uproar they cause in a perfectly nice young fire department, as they "do their stuff" on fire trucks, with hoses, desperately wallowing in mud to rescue the chief's daughter is one long laugh to the final fadeout.

The picture is not merely a string of "gags." It is a well-defined plot with exasperating comedy situations that build and keep on building, with each moment provoking new shouts of laughter.

Tom Kennedy is back with the team again. The hard-boiled non-com who made life so miserable for them in the previous pictures, continues to harass them, this time as the fire captain. He makes a splendid foil for Beery and Hatton.

"Belle Of Broadway" At Colonial

Those who have seen this picture say that it has few rivals among entertaining screen dramas.
