Betty Compson In Film At Colonial

Betty Compson is too well known to mention picture audiences to need an introduction. She introduced herself most successfully back in 1920 in "The Miracle Man," and since then has been appearing in a long list of film productions with different producers.

In "The Girls of Broadway," which is showing for the last time today, she has one of the most interesting roles she has ever played. It's the type of part which gives her an opportunity to act, and, at the same time, wear beautiful clothes and costumes.

She plays the part of a talented young actress in Paris who passes herself off as an actress and is eventually discovered. Miss Compson has never looked lovelier than she does in this picture, and particularly in the Du Barry costumes. These latter were designed especially for this picture and the wigs she wears have never been surpassed on stage or screen for beauty of texture and design.

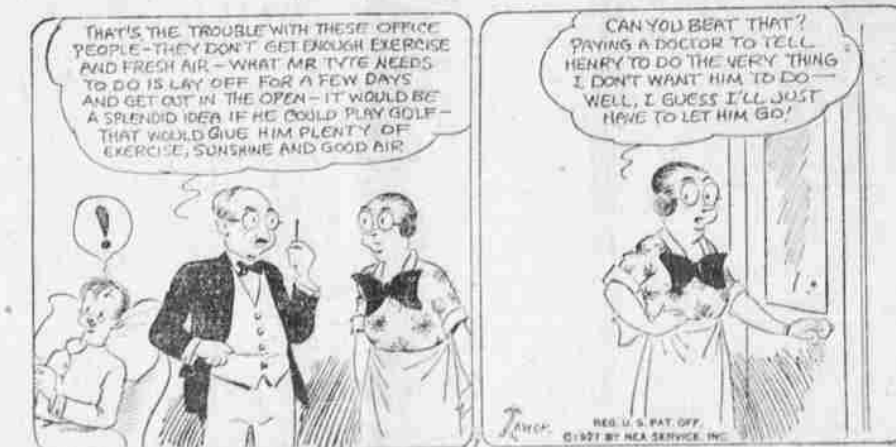
