**CANADIAN YIELD DISTURBS MART**

**Wheat And Corn Prices Suffer Setback—Close Unsettled, 2c Lower**

CHICAGO, Sept. 12 (AP)—Wheat and corn prices suffered a severe fresh setback today, wheat collapsing nearly 5 1/2c and corn 5 1/2c. The only disturbing influence was the Canadian government crop report which, taken with recent official figures from Washington, showed 77,000,000 bushels more wheat in Canada and the United States than at this time last year. Wheat started 7c to 5 1/2c off and subsequently fell to 5c near the initial bottom level. Corn opened 2 1/2c to 5 1/2c down, but later advanced some what before recovering to what. Cash price higher and provisions market unsettled.

Wheat closed unsettled 2 1/2c to 2 1/2c (lower) cash 1 1/2c to 2 1/2c (lower), oats 1 1/2c to 4c off and provisions varying to 10c decline in a rise of 2 1/2c.

**Market Steady; Flour Price Is Lowest in Years**

PORTLAND, Ore., Sept. 12 (AP)—Local wholesale produce trade in its seasonable fresh fruits and vegetables showed a general upward trend today with prices holding generally about even.

California peaches 2 1/2c in 1921 and setting in basket baskets at around \$2.25 to \$2.50 per basket. Oregon and California apples are making more readily available. Liberal supplies of grapes continue and quotations are at wide ranges.

Dairy produce prices are unchanged today on the dairy exchange excepting that in the case division extras is lower at 2c per division.

Poultry and dressed birds were quoted as steady, unchanged prices in this morning's trading but receipts were heavier and the market looked slightly easier all around.

Portland flour prices are now the lowest in three years. Local millers put into effect today a 25c reduction per barrel on all millings grades. On the basis of the reduction, best family patents are listed at \$7.50, the lowest since July 15, 1921.

**Bullish Trend In Wall Street; Trading Active**

NEW YORK, Sept. 12 (AP)—A wild outburst of bullish enthusiasm in today's stock market carried nearly two score issues to new high records for the year or longer. Extreme gains in some of the high priced specialties ran from 5 to nearly 15 points. International Harvester scored 12 points to a new high record at 210 and General Motors, DuPont, American Telephone, International Telephone, Pacific Telephone, Texas and Pacific and New York Central and sold 4 to nearly 7 points higher.

Coppers and oils which have been lagging behind the rest of the market developed impressive strength on reports of trade improvement.

Kennecott crossed 75 to a new peak, and gains of 1 to 2 points were quite common in other copper shares.

Halfroad shares also presented several strong spots. New York Central touched 160 for the first time in 25 years and St. Paul common and certificates attained new high levels for the year.

The closing was strong. Encouraged by the demand for investment shares, the whole list swung up briskly in the late afternoon. United States Steel from 110 to 115, General Motors from 100 to 110, and DuPont 5, General Motors, American Smelting, General Railway, Miami, Atlantic Refining, International Match preferred and United Franchise were included in numerous industrial lists, went up 2 to 4 points. Total sales approximated 3,800,000 shares.
