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Jap Ship Sounds Distress Signals

SEATTLE, Wash., Sept. 16, (AP)—Distress signals from a vessel believed to be the Yoshida Maru No. 1 were picked up early this morning by the Seattle harbor radio station. The nature of the trouble was not known. The ship's position was given as latitude 43-10 north, longitude 141-42 west.

The Yoshida Maru No. 1 carried a crew of 28 men. The position given was in the ship lane between Seattle and Japan about 270 miles from Seattle.

The distress signals were plainly heard by the Seattle harbor radio station. It was said here that the vessel had been working in the Alaskan coastal trade and was not loaded to arrive here. No word of the fate of the vessel was received here.

VANCOUVER, B. C., Sept. 16, (AP)—The Vancouver Exchange here was unable to explain the reported presence of the Japanese liner Yoshida Maru No. 1 off the Pacific coast. It was said here that the vessel had been working in the Alaskan coastal trade and was not loaded to arrive here. No word of the fate of the vessel was received here.
