done," he continued, "to prevent the 1928 convention from degenerating into a mere struggle of individuals for personal importance in party character and to the welfare of the nation. Principles and policies must come first. Personal ambitions, however legitimate, and every selfish purpose of the public should be subordinated to them."

Chief Concern
"My chief concern is the supremacy of democratic principles and progressive policies, for these mean the preservation, unimpaired, of the constitution of the United States, the suppression of nullification and the enforcement of law without which stable government is impossible and without which the blessings of liberty will disappear. Justice to agriculture without which the farmers cannot get their rightful share of national prosperity, and social and economic justice for the masses without which human opportunity cannot be widened."

After declaring that he would not be a candidate next year, Mr. McNabb said:
"But the struggle for the preservation of the constitution in its integrity for the defeat of nullification, for the obedience of law and for the steady repression of crime, for incorruptible government, for impartial justice, social and economic, for orderly progress and for wider human opportunities must be carried on and every earnest patriot must see that it is carried on. In an effort to achieve these things I shall, as a private citizen, be glad to cooperate with all those who deem them essential to the public welfare."

Milton Says McNabb Strong
Mr. Milton in his letter had told Mr. McNabb that the "progressive" democrats of the country were looking for leadership and that a survey of the nation had convinced him that "the principles and progressive policies you advocated in 1924 have grown stronger and that your strength is greater."

Spokane Comment
SPOKANE, Wash., Sept. 17 (AP)—Spokane democratic leaders received with mixed comment today the announcement of William G. McNabb that he is not a candidate for the democratic presidential nomination in 1928.

J. E. McGovern, U. S. marshal here during the Wilson administration and V. T. Tustin, a prominent demagogue, expressed a belief that McNabb's retirement left the field clear for Governor Smith.

Smith Silent

POWER INCREASED, OPINION
SAN FRANCISCO, Sept. 17 (AP)—William G. McNabb will be far more powerful fighting in the ranks for a principle than as a candidate. Gustav McNabb, San Francisco attorney and a demagogue leader of California, declared today when told that McNabb announced he would not seek the presidency in 1928.

"That simplifies the situation very much," McNabb said, "and it will tend to eliminate factionalism within the party. It is too sorry, of course to predict just what direct result Mr. McNabb's action will have on other prospective candidates."

70 Jap Fishermen Reported Missing

TOKYO, Sept. 17 (AP)—A delayed official report states that 70 fishermen are missing and that 134 fishing boats were captured off Amakusa Island, southwest of Kyushu, during the recent typhoon and tidal wave there.

The typhoon caused at least 400 deaths in villages in the prefecture of Kumamoto, near Nagasaki.

TOKYO, Sept. 17 (AP)—Reports received today by the newspaper (Hochi) state that the Japanese warship, Wampan, Maru, which was reported in Vladivostok yesterday to have sunk with the loss of 500 seamen, was sighted off the Kurile Islands.

The newspaper says that the vessel, owned by the Kawasaki steamship company, lost only nine sailors.

FARMERS MAKE AN INDUSTRY

Tillamook stands out as Oregon's best example of dairy development, with the agricultural problem solved apparently for all time. The story of Tillamook is a story of farmers making an industry—a big industry—and profiting by it to a degree that is astounding to anyone who has not followed the progress of dairying in that section.

Now, we are told on good authority, there are over twelve thousand dairy cows in the Tillamook section—and it looks it to drive through. There are cows on every hand, in every pasture, in every barnlot. Cows that are bred especially because of their superior dairy characteristics. Cows that bring a premium on the market. And equally as numerous as the cows, it seems, are the cream cans on platforms before every farm house. Cans that take the farm product to Tillamook; cans that assure a big check every month, year-in and year-out. There may be farmers engaged in other lines than dairying but they are hard to find and, we assume, are small in number.

Tillamook farmers not only own the dairy farms and the dairy stock but they own, in the city of Tillamook, the cheese factories to which their milk and cream is sent. The payroll of those mutually owned cheese factories is over two million dollars a year. Two million dollars—more than the total payroll of the Union Pacific in La Grande. An industry built, owned and made possible by the dairy farmers of Tillamook.

The cheese factories are joined together for sales purposes into a united sales organization which controls and markets the entire cheese product of the community. The price secured for cheese is directly reflected in the checks received by farmers for their milk. Almost without exception they are able to get more for their product—considerably more—than they could get by selling the cream in the usual way and shipping to Portland or other creameries. When the cheese price is low or there seems to be danger of flooding the market, the selling organization orders a factory to shut down. The cream is shipped to Portland and sold and the lower return is shared equally among the other factories.

The demand for dairy products, for butter, for cheese, for milk and cream, is constantly increasing. Dairying offers an increasingly satisfactory return for the farmer who wants to be sure of an adequate income from an average size farm. In some sections of the country dairy cows are owned profitably even though the operator is forced to buy all his hay and feed, growing none of it. In Tillamook they buy much hay from sections of the state east of the Cascades.

Union and Wallowa counties are developing in dairying. Much more development is possible. No more ideal sections for operating dairy herds can be found in the state, according to the agricultural experts of the government. Already a cheese factory is successfully established at Enterprise and growing rapidly. Our own creameries are flourishing. And cheese factories and creameries are not the only profitable outlets for dairy products. Evaporated milk plants can be attracted to a good dairy community. Possibilities are great and will be realized more rapidly in the coming years, we believe. It solves the problem of agriculture, as does other varieties of diversification, without waiting for the doubtful benefits of federal legislation.
