Idaho Prune Crop Is Moving Rapidly

BOISE, Idaho, Sept. 26.—Prunes are moving rapidly in the southwest Idaho district, reported M. L. Davis, director of plant industry, after a personal examination of the orchards. Quality is high and prices are generally fair, he declared.

"The apple crop is making rapid progress for color and quality," declared Mr. Davis. "Winter business. King David and Grimes. Col. are moving out now. The Idaho Junction harvest will start sometime between September 26 and 27."

Prices, Mr. Davis said, are fair. He reported a heavy export demand, the largest in years, and far in excess of that in 1926.

The field, he said, is full of boys, especially from the middle west and looking for the crop is active.
