Kansas Coach Tells Story of The Origin of Football Huddle System

EMPORIA, Kan.—H. W. (Bill) Hargis veteran mentor of the Emporia Teachers' college here, is generally credited with being the first to use the huddle system in football. A high school quarterback of McMinnville, Ore., says Hargis the idea.

In discussing the huddle recently, Hargis told the story of its beginning.

"While coach of the Oregon Aggies in Corvallis in 1913, I referred a high school football game in McMinnville. The field had no bleachers and a low fence failed to keep the crowd from swarming on the field. For three periods the game was scoreless. Near the end of the last quarter the McMinnville team started a drive and carried the ball to their opponents' 10 yard line.

"All this time the cheering was deafening. The quarterback had been yelling at the top of his voice to make his signals heard and was wearing himself out. Finally, unable to make himself heard above the din, he pulled off his headgear, threw it on the ground and yelled:

"Come back here, you guys, and I'll tell you what the play is."

The boys came back, gathered around him. He gave them the play and they went through it.

YANKEES, PIRATES IN OPENING GAME

Kremer, for Pittsburg, Hoyt, for New York, Occupy the Mound

PITTSBURGH, Oct. 5. (AP)—World series guessing gave way today to solid facts as the Pittsburg Pirates and New York Yankees went out to say it with baseball bats and curves.

Opening of the series found everyone satisfied but a large number of fans and Horv Penneck.

Many of their leaders during the regular championship season had no definite and certain plans for getting in the park today, and the star Yankee left hander was limping about with a bruised knee.

There were not enough tickets to go around for Forbes field, home of the National league champions, can seat only a few hundred over 40,000 under normal conditions, with standing room for several thousand more.

Hundreds who failed to get tickets stood and waited throughout the night for the gates to open this morning. They earned their places in the temporary stands erected outside the park but commanding a fine view of the field.

Penneck's Chances
Penneck's injury, suffered in batting practice yesterday when he was struck above the knee by a liner from the left handed bat of Charlie Durrant, appeared serious, although his physician declared that the left hander who has never been charged with a world's series defeat, will be ready when the teams move to New York.

Some of the pitcher's mates shook their heads in doubt.

Even without the services of Penneck the Yankees' pitchers staff is in good shape with Hoyt, Moore, Schaefer and Burgess capable of assuming the full burden if needed. Manager Huggins has declared that he takes no stock in a popular superstition that the Pirates are "holson" to southpaws. If Penneck's leg permits he will start a game.

Ray Kremer, big, strong and smart, was expected to prove the keystone of the Pittsburg defense. The huge Californian, named to start the ball rolling for the Pirates was informally and unofficially named by Pittsburg fans to pitch two games, regardless of the length of the series and three of it goes the limit.

To follow Kremer the Pirates have Vic Aldridge, Carmen Hill and Lee Meadows to start, and John Mifflin, with a great change of pace, standing in the front rank of the rescue squad.

Yankees Favored
The Yankees went into the championship tussle bolstered by a slight edge in popular support, won by their reputation for long distance hitting. The sport's world loves the wallop and the Yankees have it. The Pirates are no mean hitters but they do not slam the ball high and far away as do the Yankees, inspired by the super-slugger of Babe Ruth and Lou Gehrig.

Conceding the power of the American league attack, the national league counter with a conviction that they will be able to prove that the best offense is not the best defense in baseball.

The Buccaneers believe that they match the slugging of the Yankees with speed. If the series could be decided by a relay race the home team would win.

Babe A Popular Hero
To many of the men in the street and ball park today the Yankees are Babe Ruth. The big slugger is a greater novelty in Pittsburg than in the National league cities he visited to play the American league representative. He has played once in Pittsburg, in an exhibition game.
