Trial of Justice Barnes Is Resumed

MEDFORD, Oct. 6 (AP)—The trial in federal court of William B. Barnes, ex-sheriff, and now justice of the peace of Klamath Falls; A. D. Lambert, and L. D. Rice, charged with conspiracy to violate the national prohibition act, was resumed this morning before Federal Judge Robert S. Bean.

At an overtime session yesterday afternoon, Miss L. B. Haig, of Klamath Falls, a public stenographer, testified that she occupied offices across the street from "The Snook" owned by Lambert, and where Barnes and Rice were employed.

Miss Haig testified that for weeks she had seen Geo. Evenson and Jack Miller, co-defendants, who have pleaded guilty, in front of "The Snook" and adjoining buildings, meeting men, entering automobiles, and going into a passageway which contained a doorway leading to a rooming house.
