## Strong Cast Supports Pola in "Barbed Wire"

The tense, dramatic, story of a Normandy farm girl who is irresistibly attracted by and forced in spite of all instinctive barriers to love a war-time German prisoner is Pola Negri's newest starring vehicle for Paramount, opening at the Arcade theater today.

As Mona, the French girl, Miss Negri has one of the greatest roles of her remarkable career. Under the supervising eye of Erich Pommer, the continental film genius, and with the sympathetic direction of Rowland V. Lee, the great tragedienne worked in an atmosphere perfectly suited to her temperament.

Clive Brook plays Oskar, the German prisoner. Born in England, Brook did not take up his stage and screen work till after service at Vimy Ridge, the Battle of Messines and in other engagements with his British unit. He has played opposite Betty Compson, Jetta Goudal and many others with the foremost film companies, his work for Paramount has been outstanding.

Elmer Hanson, the young Swedish player, has been cast as the brother. He is a film protégé of Mauritz Stiller, the Swedish director who recently finished "Hotel Imperial," Erich Pommer's first production in America for Paramount.

Claude Gillingwater, with 20 years of stage and six years of screen experience, plays the father.

Gustav von Seffelt, cast as the profiteering neighbor, is a veteran actor and stage director.

Charles Lane plays the Commandant of the prison camp and Clyde Cook, acrobat of two reel comedy fame, portrays Hans, the comedy relief of the film.

## Roundup 30,000 Reindeer; Will Check Increase

AKIAK, Alaska, Oct. 13 (AP)—Preparations are being made here for the first roundup of the estimated 30,000 reindeer in the Kuskwilun river herds.

Reindeer owned by Eskimos and whites alike will be driven to Akiak for counting and marking. The roundup, which will be under the supervision of Prof. Clark M. Garber, district superintendent for the United States bureau of education, will mark the first attempt to determine the exact rate of increase in the deer herds of this region.

Since reindeer were introduced into Alaska from Siberia 25 years ago toward off threatened starvation among the Eskimos, the animals have increased in number at an estimated rate of 20 per cent a year.

Some of the herds are virtually unattended and many owners do not know how many deer they possess.

The rate of increase has far exceeded the demand and government officials have predicted that Alaskan ranges will be overstocked with the animals in another ten years unless reindeer meat finds a growing market in the states during that time.
