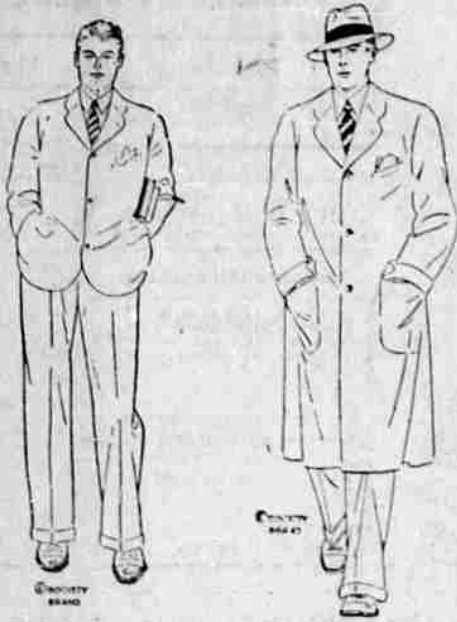

Cleveland Union Station Will Be Second Highest

CLEVELAND (AP) — Cleveland's joke-about union station, with its creaking waiting room, reminiscent of a small town terminal, will soon be a thing of the past.

In its stead is rising the second tallest tower building in the world, a railroad terminal that will cost more than \$20,000,000, which has been nearly six years in construction and which rivals in scope and beauty the great stations of the world.

The structure abuts on Cleveland's public square. It is a project of O. P. and M. J. Van Swearingen, who proposed the erection of a new union station to the New York Central and Baltimore and Ohio railroads after they acquired the Nickel Plate and Erie roads.

The building proper is nearing completion. Yards, platforms, approaches and train sheds are yet to be constructed and engineers estimate that trains will be running into the new terminal about 1929.

The station tower is 708 feet high, exceeded only by the 722-foot Woolworth building in New York. The terminal building has 52 stories.

For years various Cleveland groups, both civic and public, quarreled over the location of a new station. The settlement resulted after the Van Swearingens got actively into railroading.

In the meantime presidents, visiting foreign dignitaries and other notables detained in a sooty, venerable train shed that would hardly be considered a decent freight terminal in a small town.

VERDICT: ACCIDENTAL DEATH

ROSEBURG, Ore., Oct. 12 (AP)—A verdict of accidental death was returned late last night by the coroner's jury in the inquest into the death of Lloyd Davis who was shot and killed by a hunting companion Sunday, Oct. 8. Edward Strader, who fired the shot, claimed that he had been following a deer after separating from Davis and George Bradburn, who were directed to go to a stand directly north of them. Strader says that he finally caught a glimpse of the deer and shot and that as he did so he heard Davis scream. Yesterday he returned to the spot with officers and pointed out where he was standing, where the deer was and where Davis stood.

SHIP OUT GRAPE

GIANTS PASS, Oct. 12 (AP)—The first carload of grapes from Josephine county was shipped from here yesterday. The car was composed of Tokays and Malagas and was the first of 15 cars to be shipped this season. The grapes are of an excellent quality this year. All are going into the Portland market.
