

P. I. STOCK SHOW TO OPEN OCT. 29

Competition Between the
Boys' and Girls' Clubs
Expected to Be Keen

PORTLAND, Ore., Oct. 27.—Rivalry promises to be keen in the boys' and girls' club department of the Pacific International Livestock exposition, October 29 to November 5. Prizes and scholarships totaling \$5,297 are offered by the exposition and by various individuals, companies and associations. Reports the club department of the O. A. C. extension service. More entries are being made than ever before.

The O. M. Plummer \$25 scholarship to the Oregon Agricultural college for the highest scoring individual in the stock judging contest is attracting particular attention among the older club members.

Another \$25 scholarship to O. A. C. is offered by H. Kramer, confectionery caterer, Pacific International Livestock exposition, to the champion showman in the cattle classes.

A large increase is shown in livestock entries. Oregon entries to date are 266 hogs, 60 sheep, 80 dairy cattle and 15 beef cattle. The annual sale of club fat stock will be held on Wednesday, Nov. 2. Proceeds from this sale last year amounted to about \$8,000, and it is expected that they will be larger this year.

Between 30 and 40 livestock judging teams have been entered from Oregon, Washington, and Idaho, and it is probable that there will be teams from Utah, Nevada, California and possibly from other states.

The program of activities sent out by Camp Plummer indicates something doing each day from 9 o'clock in the morning until 9 or 10 o'clock in the evening, consisting of judging work, demonstrations, trips to places of interest and other features of entertainment for boys' and girls' club members.

First Specs Were on Nero's Nose;

Made of Emerald, Opticians Find

OXFORD, England (AP)—Nero was the first to wear spectacles, it was contended here at the International Optical congress.

According to authentic historical records, Nero wore spectacles of emerald, as a protection against bright rays of the sun more than an aid to his eyesight, it was declared.

Spectacles were also worn by Chinese mandarins in the early days. Investigation has revealed that these were of plain glass and worn simply to give the mandarin an appearance of wisdom and dignity.

The Spectacle Makers' company came into existence in London in the time of Charles I and dealt in spherical lenses in rime. These were used as magnifying glasses and the company took as its motto: "A blessing to the aged." It was about a hundred years ago that an English optician by the name of Fuller invented cylindrical glasses.

Farm Pointers

Some Oregon farmers succeed because they use a grain binder or other expensive implement for 10 or 15 years while their neighbor buys a new one every five years.

More farm equipment rusts out than wears out, is the finding of the Experiment Station. An implement shed to house all farm machinery often makes the difference between 20 per cent and 10 per cent depreciation—enough to build such a shed.

The rose saw-fly which attacks all roses in Oregon may be controlled by spraying with lead arsenate, says the entomologist at the state college. The larva is a small, dark green, snail-like worm, fed on the underside of the leaves in the spring. A dust made up of one part of calcium or lead arsenate and six parts of hydrated lime or powdered sulfur is also used for the control of this pest.

The preparation of bees for winter in Oregon is best done during October and early November, says the bee specialist of the department of entomology. Bees to pass successfully the winter are given ample stores and water protection. Details regarding wintering of bees are contained in Extension bulletin 349.

Serious hollow-heart sometimes prevalent in potatoes in Oregon may be detected by passing them over a strong light in which the same way that eggs are candled. Sound potatoes show the light through them very readily, while hollow-heart, usually darker in color, shows cloudy areas, according to results obtained at the Experiment Station.

Idaho State to Guard Against Sheep Disease

BOISE, Idaho, Oct. 27.—Stringent rules to insure that sheep infected with scab shall not enter Idaho have been adopted by the Idaho sheep commission, and will go into effect Nov. 1, it was announced by Dr. J. S. Pade, inspector in charge for the commission.

The regulation, adopted in the form of a resolution, provides that the state veterinarian of Washington is to appoint a sufficient number of inspectors to handle the Washington-Idaho movement of sheep, subject to the approval of the inspector in charge of the United States bureau of animal industry at Olympia and the Idaho board of sheep commissioners.

Applicants for inspection must obtain written or telegraphic approval to ship or trail sheep into Idaho from the federal inspector in charge in Olympia, by furnishing him with accurate information as to the original owner of sheep, the range upon which they have been run for the preceding six months, wool brands and identification marks. Upon receipt of approval the shipper or owner, the sheep will be inspected by a district inspector and if the sheep are free from any disease a certificate will be issued. The original and the approval must be attached to the bill of lading.

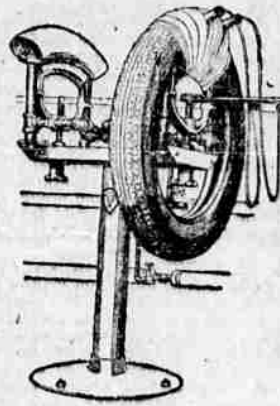
