"St. Elmo" Opens At Colonial On Sunday

She was a girl who bartered her
tongue to another to satisfy her con-
suming lust for his faithless
friend. And as the neighbors
gazed upon her, they wondered,
even as do countless others, what
the world is coming to. This prob-
lem strikes the fire that explodes
the bombshell of engrossing ro-
mance and plot in the Fox Film
release, "St. Elmo," which comes to
the Colonial theater on Sunday
for a two day run.

John Gilbert plays the title role
in this film version of Augustus J.
Evans' famous story, a role emi-
nently suited to his dynamic per-
sonality. In the part of the faith-
less girl is that popular favorite,
Barbara La Marr. Miss La Marr
plays her "love cards" with im-
passioned sincerity.

Following the disaster brought
about by her treachery, St. Elmo,
a man whose cheery illusions of
life have turned to charred husks
of bitterness, roams the earth.
Vainly he looks for a little peace.
But he can't get away from him-
self until he returns home again
and there finds wistful little Edna
Earle (played by Bessie Love),
who has come to be a companion to
his mother.

How Edna Earle through sin-
cerity and honor guides St. Elmo's
embittered soul into the light again
leads to a climax of rare power.
The cast, carefully selected, in-
cluded beside John Gilbert, the
star, and the two feminine leads,
Miss La Marr and Miss Love, War-
ner Baxter, Lydia Knott and Nigel
De Brulier. Jerome Storm directed
and Jules Furthman adapted
Miss Evans' romance for the
screen.

"The Big Parade"
To Open at
Arcade Monday

The forthcoming engagement of
"The Big Parade," King Vidor's
picture of Laurence Stallings' re-
cent World War story, which
opens at the Arcade theater Mon-
day is being much discussed, and
the opening is awaited with keen
interest.

Those who have had the advan-
tage of seeing "The Big Parade"
in other cities predict that motion
pictures will take another step for-
ward with the showings of this
production, which contains a great
deal.

The supporting cast is admirably
chosen. Otto Harlan as the at-
torney for both parties is extreme-
ly ludicrous. The court sequence,
by the way, is about the funniest
bit of work that we have ever
seen in the screen. It is a laugh
from start to finish.

William Austin is as humorous
as ever and Marcelita Daly is de-
lectable as the vamp. Henke
Conklin is a funny watchman
while Burr McIntosh, as the sober
judge is unbeatable.

Popular Team in
New Comedy-Drama
Coming to Star

"When you're all dressed up
And have no place to go,
Life seems weary, dreary and
slow."

The lines of the old song might
well have been written to describe
the opening situation of the pic-
ture at the Star theater Sunday
and Monday which appropriately
bears the title of "No Place to
Go."

Mary Astor is seen as the typi-

love story and abounds in humani-
ty and humor.

The theme deals with a phase
of the World War, but that mighty
theme is handled for the first
time not politically nor as melo-
dramatic spectacle, but the intima-
te drama of the individuals who
struggled, fought, loved and suf-
fered.

This method of treating the per-
sonal side of epic events was
brought to the fore for the South-
ern story by "The Birth of a Na-
tion," and for the Eastern locale
it was developed by "Way Down
East." In "The Covered Wagon"
the fortunes of the Wingate family
in their cross-continent pilgrimage
formed the exciting interest.
Now in "The Big Parade" Stallings
and Vidor have a theme enthrall-
ing to all Americans in the story
of three doughboy musketeers and
a French girl during the Ameri-
can push across the Ardennes.

John Gilbert, the star, Karl
Dane and Tom O'Brien appear as
American buddies, while the fami-
lious girl, Melvande, is enacted by
Renée Adoree, herself
