### Kaiser's Enemy Claimed by Death

LONDON, Oct. 31 (AP)—One of the characters who was part of the imperial atmosphere of Germany, a bitter critic of the Kaiser, has passed from the scene. Maximilian Harden, noted German editor, who founded Die Zukunft in 1882, died at Montana-Vermala, a Swiss resort in the valley of the Rhone aged 66. Death was attributed to bronchitis.

His passing attracted general attention as he was long known not only as a publicist, but as the man who bore the Kaiser, between him and Harden there was strong mutual hatred. Since Harden entered the patronage of Bismarck some saw the "iron chancellor's" hand directing the pen which Harden wielded so bitterly against the Kaiser and his court.

Perhaps, however, he will be remembered here and in the countries associated with Great Britain in the war best as the outspoken critic of his own country in numerous articles published in both American and British press.

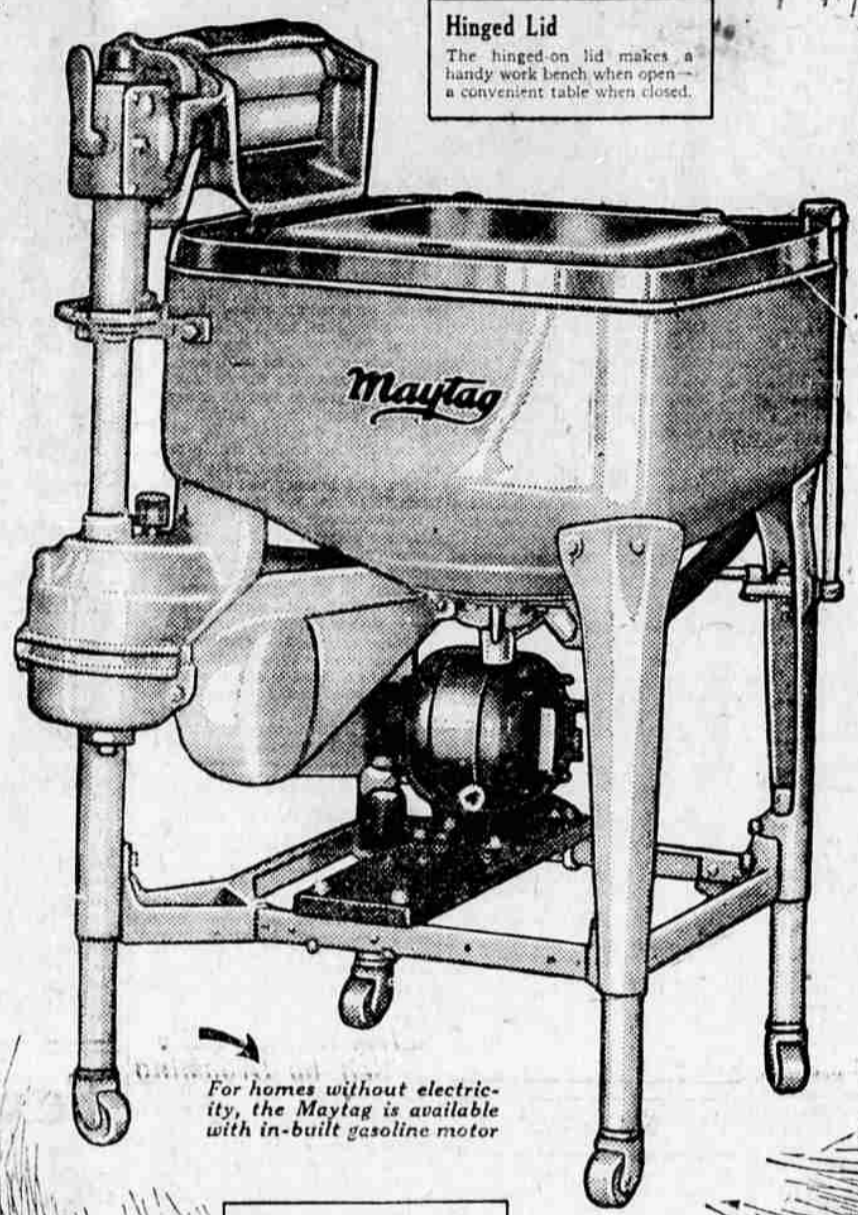
