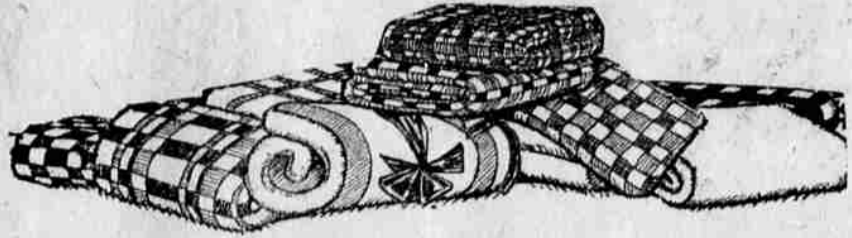

University of Chicago Opens Medical Center

CHICAGO (AP)—A group of great buildings, rising in the beauty of modern Gothic, will be dedicated on the University of Chicago campus Oct. 31, marking the formal opening of one of the greatest medical centers in the world and the inauguration of a new theory in medical education.

For years educators and physicians dreamed of completion of the university medical school. Millions began to pour in for its erection and maintenance and now the principal structures have been completed.

The buildings soon to be opened represent an investment of \$29,400,000. The structures cost \$7,000,000 to erect and the remainder is in endowment.

Facing the famous Midway is the facade of the principal building, catching light with its soft-toned stone, while behind it and linked to it stretch other buildings in the center.

In medical education at the university, the principle of the great Paracelsus, doctor and chemist of the sixteenth century has been adopted. The ancient physician said "illustrious doctors might be graduated from books, but books made not a single physician."

So the buildings have been designed so that words and laboratories and the various departments are physically united. The physician will follow a case from bedside to laboratory. At his command, and at the command of the student, will be resources of all the basic sciences and the facilities of the scientific departments of the university.

Such correlation exists in no medical school in the country, say officials of the university.

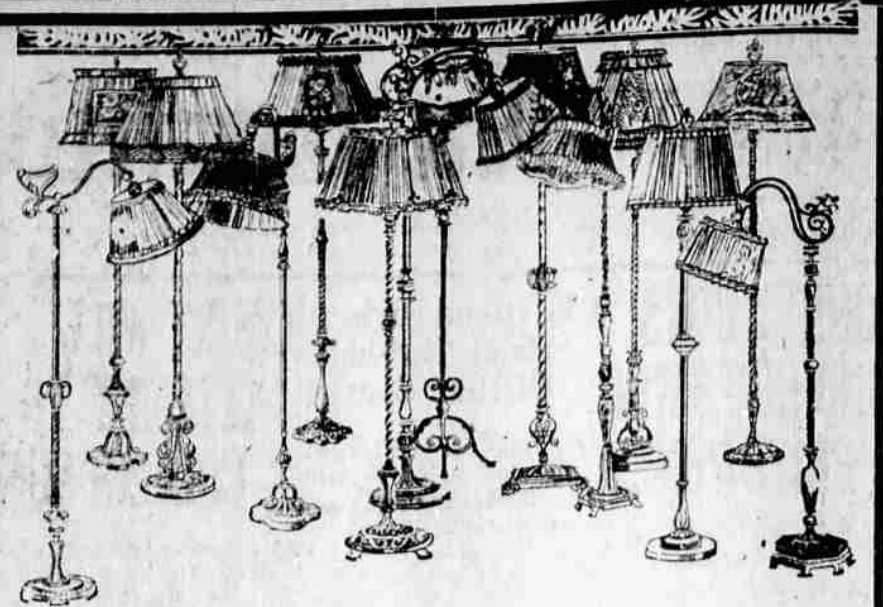
Included in the structure ready for dedication are the Albert Merritt Billings Hospital and the Max Epstein clinic. A million dollars was given for the Billings Hospital by C. R. L. Billings, C. H. Handcock, A. B. Rutledge and Dr. Frank Billings. Albert Merritt Billings was the center of former-day Chicagoans who made vast riches while the city grew and turned back many of their millions to help it progress.

Epstein, a Chicago business man, and his wife gave funds for the Epstein clinic.

When all departments of the medical school are functioning, 400 carefully selected students will be in training, taught by a faculty of 100.

WALKER DEFENDS TITLE IN CHICAGO

Knocks Out Mike McTigue in First Round—Irishman Out 5 Minutes

CHICAGO, Nov. 2 (AP)—David Barry the referee who made a name for himself as he blunted over Gene Tunney last September, could have counted 200 over the ancient Mike McTigue last night for all Mike cared.

Barry, appearing for the first time since the Tunney-Dempsey fight, was the third man in the ring as McTigue, looking frail and drawn, faced Mickey Walker, the middleweight champion, for what was supposed to be 10 rounds of fighting. Actually the fight lasted two minutes and 15 seconds—end including the five minutes McTigue was unconscious.

Three times Mike went down before a smart, champion-like attack. The first time he was up at once, but groggy Walker, avoiding Dempsey's error, went to the far corner of the ring. When McTigue got up Mickey taunted the older fighter's mid section and then when the McTigue guard dropped, sent lefts and rights to the head. McTigue fell against the ropes and slid to the canvas.

Mike Wide Open
Up at nine, Mike was a wide open mark for Walker's machine gun speed and cannon power. McTigue was out against the ropes, hanging partly from the ring over the middle strand. Then he jumped to the floor and the formalty of a count was completed. In his corner his seconds labored long before Mike, principal in many a great fight and a former light heavyweight champion, himself was able to understand who threw the brick.

Protests Against Football on Nov. 11

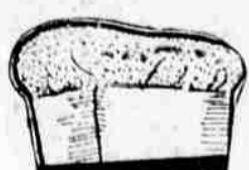
ROSEBURG, Ore., Nov. 2 (AP)—A vigorous protest against the holding of major football games on Armistice day is contained in a resolution adopted here last night by the Umpqua post of the American Legion. The resolution contends that Armistice day exists only because of the sacrifice made by the men engaged in the World War and that therefore it is a holiday belonging peculiarly to the ex-service men. American Legion posts throughout the state of Oregon, it is contended, use the day for reunions among veterans and as a time for celebrations to raise revenue for community welfare work and to care for disabled comrades and orphans of deceased comrades. Major football

games, such as occurs this year between the University of Oregon and the Oregon State college draw people away from their local celebrations and handicap the American Legion posts on their own holiday. The resolution contends. Copies are being forwarded to the state department of the American Legion and to the college and university heads.
