

MAROONED IN WYOMING SNOWS

Auto Buses in Trouble at Medicine Bow—Three-Day Blizzard Cause

SALT LAKE CITY, Utah, Nov. 3 (AP)—Seventy-five bus passengers and members of private auto parties were marooned in Medicine Bow, Wyoming, last night when drifts from a three-day blizzard blocked highways on both sides of the little town on the crest of the continental divide.

Information reaching Salt Lake City by telephone indicated that several passengers of one bus were injured when the big car skidded

in the soft muck under the snow and capsized. The driver of another bus, Jack Hawkins, of Denver, was burned slightly when his machine ran into a high tension wire as it was leaving Laramie, Wyo. The bus caught fire and drove the passengers into the snow where they were picked up by another bus and carried through to Medicine Bow, nearly 50 miles.

Highway crews are working on the roads and expect to drive at least two detours through the snow, many passengers abandoned the buses at Laramie and Rock Springs, Wyo., and arrived in Salt Lake City today.

Stories of the buses plunging blindly through the blizzard, plowing into drifts and skidding into gullies beside the road were told by the passengers.

Three passengers on one of the buses have not been definitely accounted for. Passengers on the

bus which burned said they saw three of their number struggling through the deep drifts in search of a farm house. Hawkins, driver of the bus, declared, however, that none of his passengers were missing. Highway officials at Laramie received no reports during Wednesday afternoon of any missing in the storm.

Weeds in a grain field increase the cost of harvesting, because for any given quantity it costs as much to harvest and handle the weeds as it does to harvest and handle the grain. Weeds likewise increase the cost of threshing, because it costs as much and often more to thresh a unit weight of weed seeds than it does for grain.

Farm Pointers

Warehousing is essential to efficient cotton marketing. It affords physical protection from damage by weather or dust; from loss because of fire, mutilation or petty pilfering and from tag switching and other forms of fraud or theft. It provides the means of converting the raw cotton into more desirable collateral and makes possible a policy of gradual marketing.

Storage rots, caused by various fungi, are a very serious cause of loss to cranberry growers, both in the quantity of berries and in effect on the good will of the trade. It has been demonstrated that two applications of Bordeaux mixture, the first just before blossoming and the second immediately following blossoming, will control the development of storage rots satisfactorily.

Open flame lights never should be allowed in the garage or the building containing the farm tractor or gasoline engine, and such a building never should be heated by a stove. It is safer if the automobile and tractor are run outside before the tanks are filled, so that the vapor may be carried away immediately. Water, unless applied in very large quantities, has no effect on burning gasoline except to spread the fire.

Noticable infestation with the sugar beet nematode is found only in fields which have produced many crops of sugar beets with little or no rotation. Throughout the western states it is not unusual for a field to have grown beets almost continuously for 10 to 25 years. This condition is ideal for the establishing and rapid growth of nematode colonies.

Based on utility alone — apart from breeding or sales value — purebred livestock has an earning power from a third to one-half greater than scrub stock. The average superiority of purebreds over scrubs for all classes of farm animals is about 40 per cent. Of the principal points in which purebreds excel other stock, the most prominent are: Superiority and uniformity in conformation to type; greater sale value, early maturity, and economy in the conversion of feed into meat, milk and wool.

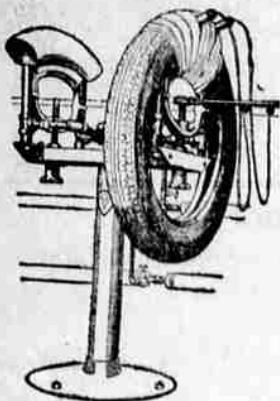
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
