PORTLAND, Nov. 7—Washington's defeat by Stanford Saturday, 13 to 7, eliminates the Huskies and leaves three teams, Southern California, Stanford and Idaho undefeated, although each has played a tie conference game.

Stanford is now headed for another conference title. Only California remains on the cards and the championship and the Bears are hardly expected to be very troublesome, although they have a fair all-around team.

As for Southern California, the Trojans have a hard road ahead. They must face the same troublesome Huskies that the Cards had so much difficulty defeating before facing Washington at Los Angeles; they must play Notre Dame at Chicago and the week before that the Washington State Cougars go to Los Angeles for an annual tussle. The Cougars are always dangerous.


Idaho isn't taken seriously in conference circles, although the Vandals did defeat themselves gloriously against St. Mary's Saturday, holding the Salts to a 2-10-3 tie. Idaho's scoreless tie game with Oregon, however, goes against her record. The Vandals have two more games against Washington State at Pullman Friday and against O. A. C. at Portland the week following. As the Aggies and Cougars have both been defeated twice and Montana, undefeated early in the season by the Vandals, has been beaten four times, Idaho's claim, should she win both her remaining games, would be somewhat shakier.

California, after her 33-10-12 victory over Montana last week end, will meet Washington at Berkeley next Saturday, while the Cards will be entertaining Santa Clara at Palo Alto, and the Trojans playing host to Colorado at Los Angeles Saturday and Montana will meet in Missoula.

Earl Sande Has Hopes of Being Held Guiltless

BALTIMORE, Nov. 7 (AP)—Earl Sande, America's premier jockey, today has a standing vindication of the charges that caused the Maryland racing commission to bar him from all tracks in north America. "I am innocent of any wrong," he said, "and I hope to be vindicated and intend remaining here for the purpose of seeing this thing through."

The jockey, whose skills whirled ahead in many a major race, has written asking the commission to grant him an opportunity to tell his story and introduce three witnesses in his behalf. The witnesses he declared are all jockeys who rode in the maiden victory Friday when Sande on Bateau is alleged to have deliberately cut in front of Regh Court, the favorite, forcing him against the rail and ruining his stride.

The appeal was posted yesterday and Josh Spencer Jr., a member of the commission when told of Sande's action said the commission would be willing to listen to anything the rider might have to say.
