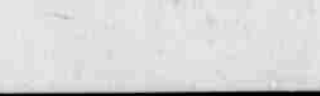
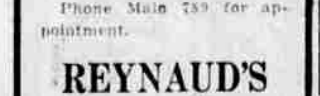
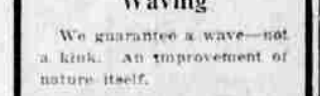

spoons sugar, 1 egg, 3 tablespoons cornmeal, 3/4 cup flour, 2 teaspoons baking powder, 1/2 teaspoon salt, 1/2 cup sweet milk.

Cream butter and sugar. Add egg well beaten. Mix thoroughly and add cornmeal, mix and stir flour, baking powder and salt and add alternately with milk to first mixture. Beat well and drop from tip of spoon into oiled and floured muffin pans. Bake twenty minutes in a hot oven.

This rule will make eight good sized muffins.

CONTINUED INDIGESTION IS DANGEROUS

About one-third of the adult patients who go to a physician for service do so for some form of digestive trouble. Of these the largest number have minor disorders which simple measures can diagnose and treat successfully. A considerable number, however, are really suffering because of some serious disease such as cancer, ulcer, or gall stones, and in the majority of these the symptoms are similar to those of the simple and minor forms of indigestion. It is for this reason that a person who has a continued form of indigestion should resort to a thorough examination. The experience of specialists in digestive diseases is that a great many people walk around with serious conditions of which they are ignorant or about which they are careless.

Indigestion is repeatedly found in people who have only a few months to live. In most of these there had been a continuation of indigestion symptoms to which little or no attention had been paid until the disease was so far advanced that little or nothing could be done in the way of a cure.

Disorders of the nervous system manifest their symptoms promptly in unmistakable ways. Indigestion of the lungs and heart distinct symptoms are early, and there are certain sounds in the function of these organs that tell what is wrong. The abdomen, however, is a silent tomb, and in it are contained organs quite as essential to life as the heart and lungs. More than that, considerable extents of diseases can be present in the stomach, liver, gall tract, pancreas, in testines, rectum, kidneys, and bladder with hardly any symptoms. It is important, therefore, in all instances of a chronic or continued indigestion that a complete examination be made to find out just what is wrong. If it then turns out to be an insignificant matter, no harm is done. That assurance in itself is worth much.

A gambler on the weather a month from now is much more of a sure thing than a chance on your life in a continued indigestion in the same length of time.

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Bridge Pointers

The pointer for today is: Queen and one small is border-line "normal support."

In previous articles I have pointed out that after South (Dealer) has opened the auction by bidding one of a Major suit and West has passed it is important for North to deny if holding less than normal support in the partner's suit; it also has been pointed out that if West overcall South's bid, North should not raise South's suit with less than normal support for it, regardless of North's side strength.

Normal support has been defined as three small cards of the suit, or Ace and one small, or King and one small; it being understood that anything lower—even a singleton Ace—was less than normal support; and that anything stronger, such as x-x-x-x or Queen-x-x, was more than normal support. The question of how Queen-x should be treated has been postponed because it is important enough to deserve special attention.

Many writers include Queen-x in the category with Ace-x and King-x, and consider it normal support. This is questionable; while the Queen is more helpful than a small card, Queen-x is rarely as useful as three small cards of the trump suit. In other words, Queen-x averages below x-x-x in its assisting value.

The latest expert conclusion is that Queen-x is the borderline combination. It is a holding which permits optional handling; the remainder of the hand being the determining factor in the decision.
