MENUS

By Sister Mary
BREAKFAST—Cassia melon, cereal, cream, fish and rice cakes, crisp graham toast, milk, coffee.
LUNCHEON—Celery and carrots au gratin, stuffed prune salad, tapioca pudding, milk, tea.
DINNER—Broiled pork chops, apple sauce, baked squash, celery hearts, whole wheat rolls, pumpkin pie, milk, coffee.

Celery and Carrots au Gratin
 One and one-half cups dried celery, 1 1/2 cups dried carrots, 3 tablespoons butter, 2 tablespoons flour, 1 1/2 cups milk, 1 tablespoon minced parsley, 4 tablespoons coarse buttered bread crumbs, 1 teaspoon salt.
 Use all but tender hearts of celery. Cook celery and carrots together in boiling water to cover until tender. Drain if necessary. Melt butter, stir in flour and slowly add milk, stirring constantly. Season with salt and bring to the boiling point. Stir in parsley and add carrots and celery. Turn into a buttered baking dish, cover with buttered crumbs and bake in a moderate oven until crumbs are brown. Serve from baking dish.

Bridge Pointers

The pointer for today is the same as yesterday:
Queen and one small is border-line "normal support."

Yesterday's article gave six illustrative hands, all held by North. In Nos. 1, 2 and 3, South has bid one Spade and West passed.

1. Sp.: Queen-x, Ht.: Ace-Jack-x-x, Dt.: King-Queen-x, Cl.: King-10-x-x.

North should bid one No Trump. Doing so denies Spades, but with Queen-x that is optional and it is evident that the hand will work better at No Trump. With such strength in three suits, a denial would be advisable with King and one Spade, or even with Ace and one.

2. Sp.: Queen-x, Ht.: x-x-x, Dt.: Ace-Jack-9-x-x, Cl.: x-x-x.

A denial by a Diamond bid would be the correct declaration if the Spades were x-x; but it must be remembered that denial shows not only weakness in the suit denied, but also strength elsewhere in the hand. With hand No. 2, a player would not be anxious to make a bid as it would rather over-advertise his strength; and when such a dubious bid would be required, Queen-x may be considered normal support and the denial omitted.

3. Sp.: Queen-x, Ht.: x-x-x, Dt.: Ace-King-Jack-x-x, Cl.: x-x-x.

With this hand a denial should be made because the Diamonds are so strong that showing them is apt to be advantageous.

In Nos. 4, 5 and 6, South has bid one Spade and West two Hearts.

4. Sp.: Queen-x, Ht.: 7-6-3-2, Dt.: Ace-King-Queen, Cl.: Ace-x-x-x.

The strength of this hand justifies an assist and North should look upon his Queen-x as normal support and bid two Spades. The absence of a Heart stopper precludes a No Trump, and bidding the three-card Diamond suit should not be considered in spite of its strength.

5. Sp.: Queen-x, Ht.: x-x, Dt.: x-x-x, Cl.: x-x-x.

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11. Sp.: Queen-x, Ht.: x-x, Dt.: x-x-x, Cl.: x-x-x.

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HEALTH

BE JEALOUS OF YOUR EARS

For convenience of study, the ear is divided into external, middle, and internal. The external ear is that portion external to the drum and is subject to infections of the canal and to an over-supply of wax. The infections of the canal are ordinarily eczema and fungus growths, but there is also a possibility of almost any kind of bacteria invading the many small glands in the canal.

The middle ear comprises the eustachian tube, drum, small bones, and a cavity immediately back of the drum into which the

eustachian tube opens. It is through the nose and mouth that middle ear infections take place. The internal ear is the sound producing apparatus and comprises the vestibule, semi-circular canals, cochlea and auditory nerve. The semi-circular canals are three in number in each ear and are the

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operation of the human body which enable us to assume and maintain an erect position. Affection of these canals will disturb equilibrium, and involvement of the internal ear structure usually signifies permanent deafness.

Deficiency in hearing seriously involves efficiency. The possessor of one deaf ear is 50 per cent deficient, and if totally deaf he must adjust himself completely to his new status. Therefore, as a matter of efficiency as well as comfort and happiness, it behooves each individual to be jealous of his ears and to preserve them under any and all circumstances possible. In no case should he endanger these organs by a deliberate act of his own, and under no circumstance should he delay going to see his doctor when he notices the slightest thing wrong with his ears.

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
