Rum-Running Story Ending Run At the Star

Intensive practice in running a small steam tug through Pacific breakers was John Gilbert's latest activity—a strenuous form of training to prepare him for his role in "Twelve Miles Out," in which he is to be seen at the Star theater tonight for the last time.

The new Metro-Goldwyn-Mayer drama is a vivid filmization of William Anthony McGuire's famous stage play, based on the adventures of rum-runners and hijackers. It exposes the devious methods by which liquor smugglers evade the coast guard and bring in forbidden "hooch."

Much of it was filmed on the sea, with replicas of "rum ships" and the tugs by which cargoes of liquor are smuggled into ports and onto the coast.

Lone Eagle Here Thursday
"The Lone Eagle," featured at the Star theater Thursday and Friday, is a story of an American youth, cocky and self-centered, who becomes a member of a British flying unit at the time the late war was at its height, or perhaps worst. His reaction to the grim reality of battle and his gradual shift nevertheless forcible change from a carefree youth to serious-minded, is portrayed with a subtlety that should please the director, Emory Johnson, on a plane with our greatest directors.

Raymond Keane, who has been on the screen but a short while, is the youth. Barbara Kent plays the role of his little French sweetheart, Jack Pennick, a newcomer to the screen. Nigel Harrie, Don Stuart and Guy Sully are also in the cast.

The story was written by Lieutenant Ralph Blanchard, who was a member of the United States air service during the war.

TO ATTACK EVIL
CAMDEN, N. Messrs. Heery and Hatton went through their imitatable antics with shapely knees exposed, having donned the kilts of the Scots for this new effort.
