Oscar Noyes was a recent Perry visitor.

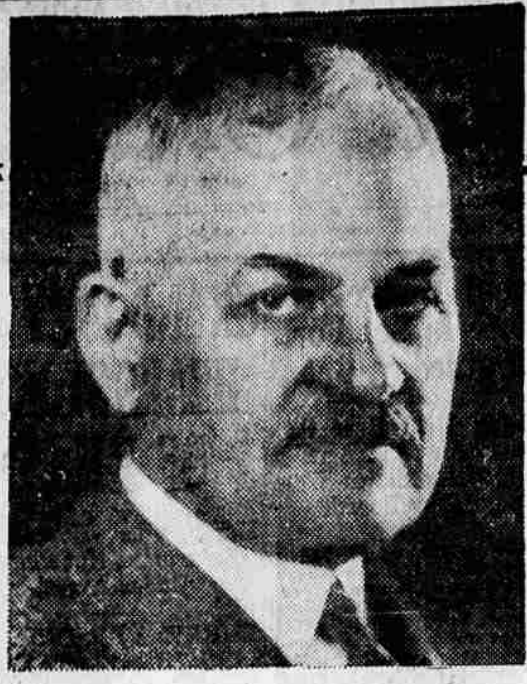
