BUTTER AND EGG PRICE UNCHANGED

Wholesale Market in Portland Opens Steady with Last Week's Close

PORTLAND, Ore., Nov. 14 (AP)—The local wholesale butter and egg markets today opened steady with last week's close. Demand is reported strong for light supplies of fresh receipts.

At a special session of the dairy exchange Saturday the exchange quotation on medium grade eggs was bid down a cent, but underbids were advanced 4c to 24c per dozen. Other grades were unchanged.

The exchange decided to resume trading in current receipt grade of eggs.

Country dressed meats and poultry were quiet but only steady in practically all lines.

The market on light hens was rather mixed, dealers quoting a top of 13½¢, while other were talking around 13c per pound.

Turkey receipts have been light the past week, and demand only ordinary, but dealers forecast a brisk trade between the first of this week and Thanksgiving day, with prices ranging near the level of a year ago.

Well conditioned young turkeys are quoted from 49 to 45c per pound, dressed, and from 50 to 35c, alive.

Dealers were beginning to send out requests to poultry shippers to rush their live hens into the market well before Thanksgiving so that most of them might receive proper attention on the dressing table before the final rush on turkeys interfered with dressing hens.

Price Movement In Wall Street Is Varied Today

NEW YORK, Nov. 14 (AP)—Price movements in today's stock market lacked uniformity, renewal of selling pressure against some of the leading industrials being offset by a resumption of bullish operations in a wide assortment of specialties.

U. S. Steel common and General Motors were in rather free supply, but offerings were well taken. Rails were quiet, although Chesapeake and Ohio were run up more than 3 points and half a dozen or so others advanced a point or more.

American Railway Express ran up nearly 6 points and was followed into new high ground by nearly a score of other issues, including Kennecott and Magna Copper, Montgomery Ward, Sears-Roebuck, International Harvester and American Can. Gabriel Snubbers was an outstanding weak spot, breaking nearly 5 points.

The closing was firm, United States Steel crossed 140, more than 2 points above its earlier low figure. There was brisk demand for General Motors and New York Central, and a number of other high priced shares were buoyant. Adams Express climbed 6 points to 182, a record price. Total sales approximated 1,200,000 shares.
