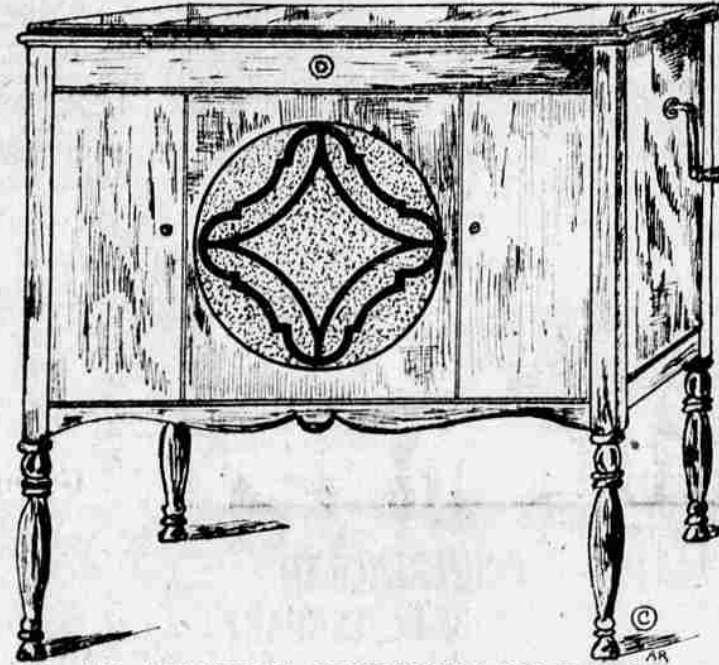

Agronomists Stress Rebuilding of Soil to Lower the Costs of Crops

WASHINGTON, (AP) — Eight county agricultural agents, whose soil improvement programs have been selected as the best submitted from 25 states of the west and northwest, are to be given a place of honor on the program of the American Society of Agronomy, meeting in Chicago Nov. 14 to 18.

Arthur J. Secor of Kossauqua, Iowa, sweepstakes winner and county agent of Van Buren county, will report on a ten-year campaign of educational work looking to soil and crop improvement lines.

Other winners are H. W. Sotile, White River, Kan.; Ralph W. Donaldson, Waltham, Mass.; George W. Kreidler, Pomeroy, O.; Ellis L. Hawk, Scottsburg, Ind.; C. E. Watson, Martinsville, Ind.; Ira Drymon, Independence, Mo.; and L. R. Snipes, Weeping Water, Neb.

Improvement campaigns by the county agents have stimulated soil-building programs necessary to re-estimation of crop costs. For the last

seven years farmers have been "mining" their soil, taking from it more elements of plant food than they have been financially able to restore. They have learned to extract the fertility of their soil more rapidly, but have not learned to rebuild economically.

In Secor's county, farmers, either individually or in groups, are now operating their own limestone crushers. Already eight or in use in the county, farmers bringing stone from Iowa quarries to crush and spread over their land.

The first few years after opening new farm land usually is marked by decreasing crop yields, agricultural specialists say, principally because of the farmers' lack of technical knowledge in soil repair. For that reason federal extension agents have conducted numerous neighborhood demonstrations this year in almost every state.

Demonstrations in liming have been popular, particularly for those who contemplate production

of clover, alfalfa, and other crops which do not thrive in an acid soil. An important effect of liming is a stimulation of the decomposition of organic matter. When lime in any form is applied to soils with insufficient organic matter, especially in warm, humid climates, experts suggest that manure be added or green crops be plowed under for the purpose of maintaining or increasing this essential soil element.

Soils require time for correction of acidity, for improvement of drainage, and to overcome the lack of lime in the plant food.

Lima beans have grown to extraordinary size on vines from which Mrs. George Hockema harvested the crop last week. She found that the plump product ran from an inch to an inch and one-half in length and from one-half to three-fourths of an inch in width.

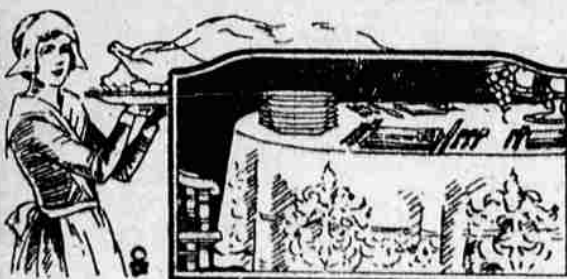
