BEARS TO PLAY CARDS TOMORROW

Stanford, California and Idaho, All Undeclared In Conference, in Test

SAN FRANCISCO, Nov. 18 (AP)—With the 1927 football season of the Pacific coast conference rapidly drawing to a close, three important contests are scheduled for Saturday, the results of which may eliminate more than one championship contender from the field. Stanford, the University of Southern California and the University of Idaho, undefeated thus far in conference competition, all meet worthy opponents.

Overlooking the other contests both in traditional rivalry and importance is the thirty-fourth annual "big game" between Stanford and the University of California. The two teams are entering the fray more evenly matched than since 1924, and many critics believe the California Bears will be able to give the Cardinals a stiff battle.

The University of Southern California Trojans, minus the services of Captain Morley Drury, backfield star who is out with a slight injury, will meet Washington State college in Los Angeles, while Idaho, last of the undefeated trio, is scheduled to clash with Oregon State college at Portland in its last conference game of the year.

Eastern Fields Muddy For Big Games Saturday

NEW YORK, Nov. 18 (AP)—Rain threatened today to turn the final Saturday of major football into the first genuinely soggy combat day of the eastern season.

Almost as depressing as the weather reports were checkups of injured as the rival camps of Harvard and Yale prepared for their forty-sixth meeting tomorrow. Joe Crosby, shining light of what offensive Harvard has shown in winning four out of seven games, seems definitely relegated to the side lines through an infected nose, developed Monday. Captain Webster, bulwark of Yale's scrummed line; Johnny Haden, who tossed the passes that beat Princeton; and John Garvey, replacement back for Bruce Caldwell, all are suffering injuries of more or less grievous nature.

Both Army and Navy practiced with an eye to each other in a rainstorm yesterday despite an engagement with U.S. and Loyola respectively on Saturday. Lafayette tapered off for the annual quarter with U.S. high, while the weather failed to halt the drive of Cornell for Pennsylvania on Thanksgiving day.

CHICAGO, Nov. 18 (AP)—Although all bear stories about injured football stars have been laid away for next year by the western conference coaches while they bear down on the traditions to inspire their squads for the closing games of the season tomorrow.

Capacity crowds are already assured at four of the games, \$2,000 for Minnesota-Michigan; \$2,000 for Illinois-Chicago; \$2,000 for Wisconsin-Chicago and \$2,000 for Purdue-Indiana.
