TURKEY MARKET CONTINUES EASY

Receipts Ample to Meet Demand—Wide Spread in Wholesale Prices

PORTLAND, Ore., Nov. 21 (AP)—The turkey market continues easy at Portland today with receipts ample to meet the demand. There is a wide spread in wholesale prices, dealers quoting from 50c to 43c with a few extra large birds bringing 40c. The prevailing prices along the street were 42 to 43c, with demand good, and a large number of birds moving at those prices.

Prospects are that prices may stiffen somewhat tomorrow and Wednesday as demand increases for Thanksgiving needs.

Prices on other fowls are holding steady around last week's prices. Light hens are bringing 16 to 17c, while heavy hens are going around 22 to 23c, with demand normal. Capons, six pounds and up, are moving in large numbers at 25 to 35c for fat birds.

Live ducks are steady at 22 to 25c.

Dressed meats continue easy, veal holding steady around 16 to 17c, while pork is still weak around 12 1/2 to 13c for the better quality.

Egg prices are steady, fresh standard extras down 1/2c to 45c; firsts steady at 40c; mediums steady at 34c and undersized likewise steady at 30c.

The butter market is steady at last week's prices.

Major Activity In Stock Market Unusually Broad

NEW YORK, Nov. 21 (AP)—Major speculative activity in today's stock market which was unusually broad in character, continued on the upside. Considerable irregularity developed at times, however, on selling impelled by the belief that a "technical reaction" was in order as a result of the rapidity of the recent advance in many issues. Gains of 1 to 6 points were scattered throughout the list, with more than 25 issues breaking into new high ground for the year.

In the copper group, Kennecott, Anaconda, Calumet and Arizona topped their previous peak prices of the year. Other issues to attain new maximums were Packard and Hupp Motors, Detroit Edison, Radio, Sunbelt Theaters, Fox Film, Congress Clear, Sears Roebuck, Transco and Williams, National Biscuit, Fleischmann and International Paper.

The closing was irregular. Many important stocks ground in the final hour in the face of aggressive manipulation in various specialties.

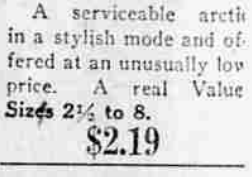
