The time of year approaches when the family will go out and buy Father a wonderful present, letting him pay the other 11 instalments.

The wild horses of the western plains are being turned into dog biscuit and chicken feed, and for the third and last time, the Frontier vanishes.

Airplane manufacturers are swamped with orders. The output for the present year will double last year's, and the output for next year is expected to treble it. The industry is still in its infancy, but is already running into big money. The value of 1927 production will be more than \$50,000,000, and from present indications the value of the 1928 production may be \$100,000,000. A visitor to the Ford factory in Detroit tells of seeing in action a new airplane only 21 feet from tip to tip, driven by a 30-horsepower engine of two opposed cylinders, and weighing altogether only 300 pounds. That plane is not on the market yet, and is merely one of Ford's many experiments. It may be the flivver of the future, dwarfing his past automobile achievement.

Cotton mill workers in Lynn, Mass., in recent months are said to have looked like a "style show" as they went to and from work. "Chic high heels" have contributed to that effect. But now the heels are down, and the girls' spirits with them. The mills have ordered the girls to wear low heels, as a safety measure, because they so often turned their ankles, or slipped and fell, while at work. Those who will not conform are refused employment. So there is a run on cobbler's shops, to cut down the aspiring heels. Those girls' spirits will probably rise again, for sound physiological reasons. And driven against their will to wear low heels for safety, they may yet wear them voluntarily for health. The same thing could be practiced in our high schools.

### THE FOREIGN TREK

There is a current idea that most American tourists who fare abroad go to Europe. They do not. They go to Canada. In the first nine months of this year 11,435,000 tourists from the United States entered the Dominion, of whom 8,500,000 entered Ontario. This, by the way, represented a gain of 20 per cent over the same period last year.

Where our visitors to Canada are numbered in millions, our visitors to all the rest of the world together are numbered only in hundreds of thousands. On the face of these figures, it looks as if one American out of every 10 has gone to Canada this year. That is not strictly true, because there have been some repeaters, but it is true enough for general purposes.

Why do they go? Well, largely because Canada's a good vacation land—picturesque, interesting, healthful, hospitable, and liquid. Also because it's a good country to do business with—a million or two of this year's visitors went on business. Also because it's close by and accessible—there's no other foreign country so easy to enter. And because, while different from our own country, it is nevertheless similar enough in language, customs and atmosphere to make traveling there more convenient and comfortable than in most other lands.

Last, and not least, because the Canadians realize the business advantages of their country appeal to us foreigners, and make the most of it. There might be more appreciation on this side of the border of the profitableness of bringing Canadians over here.

While only six men are named in the district attorney's petition, Gordon specifically requested that if upon the hearing of the cause it appeared that other persons were concerned they would be made parties to the contempt proceedings.

### Maximum Year in Prison

In making his move in the case, Gordon decided not to await the action of the grand jury. The present phase of the case will be heard by the court and not jury and should the trial justice hold there had been a contempt of the court he could impose sentences up to one year in prison.

Whether indictments are to be returned rests now with the grand jury. However, should convictions be obtained on the contempt charge there is little likelihood that indictments would be pressed as the prosecutors believe the power and authority of the court would have been adequately vindicated.
