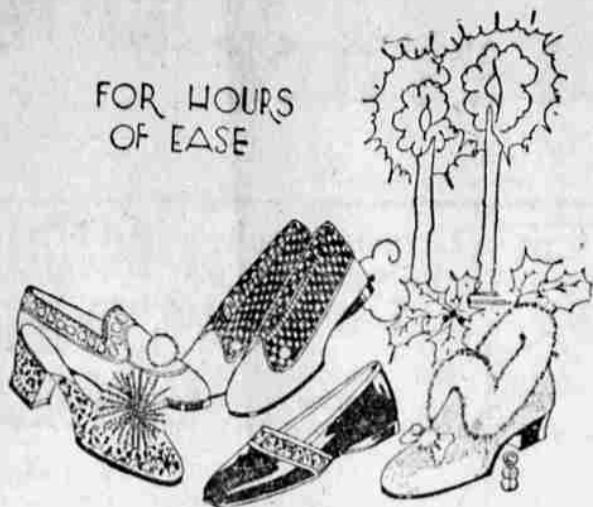

### MEDFORD, MAC-HI TO PLAY DEC. 3

Two Undeclared Eleven To Settle State Title Outside of Portland

MEDFORD, Ore., Nov. 30 (AP)—The Medford high school football team leaves here tonight to play the McLaughlin high school of Milton-Freewater, Saturday Dec. 3, for the mythical state championship outside of Portland. The action for the game was given last night by the state board of athletics. The Medford team offers to play the Tillamook high school or any other logical contender the state board may designate Saturday Dec. 10, if it wins next Saturday's game, the Dec. 10 game to be played in this city. The Medford team will not play in Portland, except to meet Grant high school.

The following men will make the trip: Bernard Hughes, center; John Hughes, Proek and Stahr, guards; Bennett, Morgan and Oscar Newlin, tackles; Bales, McDonald and Bowerman, ends; Garnett, Swanson and Walker, quarterbacks; Moore, Herman Newlin, Fredrick, halfbacks; Day and Harrell, fullbacks.

The line averages 155 pounds and the back field 185 pounds. The team ranges from Eddie Dennet, six feet four inches, 227 pounds, to Bonnie Harrell, four feet six inches, 115 pounds.

In five years of interscholastic playing Medford has been defeated only once, and has won 47 games in a row, under coach Frank Callahan.

The Medford team will arrive in Walla Walla Thursday evening and stay in that city until Saturday morning.

The local team has asked that Vincent Richards, coach of Willamette college be named as referee.

### Washington And Southern Cal To Play Saturday

SEATTLE, Nov. 30 (AP)—Coach Knoch Hughson and 22 University of Washington football players will leave here tonight for Los Angeles to engage the University of Southern California Saturday in the final contest of the 1927 coast conference schedule. The Huskies were put through a stiff formation drill and scrimmage yesterday and were called together this afternoon for the last team practice of the year. In Saturday's game the northwesterners will have little to lose. With the Stanford victory here early this month, the purple and gold hopes of the conference championship went glimmering. U. S. C. on the other hand has a chance to go into a tie with Stanford and Idaho for the title by a win over Washington.

### Joe Marcus Wins From Vicentini

PORTLAND, Ore., Nov. 30 (AP)—Joe Marcus, Portland lightweight, established himself firmly with Portland boxing fans last night when he came back from his six months' suspension and earned a well deserved draw with Luis Vicentini headed as South America's light weight champion. And Vicentini's exhibition of two-fisted fighting and never giving ground made it easy for the fans to believe his title claims. Marcus took the first three rounds, Vicentini the next four and Marcus came back in the eighth and ninth to even matters up. The fight was a thriller from start to finish. Omar Wright took a close decision from Charley O'Leary in the semi-final. George Hval and Bobby Lamarr went four fast rounds to a draw and Maxie Peit knocked out Ray Smith in the third round of the curtain raiser.

### Game Protective Body Will Meet

PORTLAND, Ore., Nov. 30 (AP)—The new Oregon Game Protective association will hold its first meeting here Friday afternoon. This will be the first gathering of sportsmen who have signed the new state statute to obey its laws to the letter and to observe the rights of property owners and tenants. The new organization succeeds the Oregon State Sportsmen's association.

About 2500 sportsmen have enrolled in the association, promising to wear the O. G. P. badge when hunting or fishing. The sportsmen whose members have signed are Salem, Dallas, McMinnville, The Dalles, Klamath Falls, Hillsboro, Hood River and the Multnomah Hunters and Anglers club of Portland. Only clubs which have taken the pledge will be entitled to representation at the Friday meeting.

### War Vets Must Act or Lose All Rights to Bonus

Warning that World war veterans stand to lose all rights to the federal adjusted compensation "bonus" unless they act before Jan. 1 was issued by Colonel J. P. O'Neil, in announcing the opening of an information center at the U. S. Army recruiting office, 203 Kravner Bldg., 2nd & Washington streets, Portland, Ore., on 24 Oct. plans in filing applications.

More than 2,000,000 ex-servicemen throughout the country, with claims aggregating possibly half a million dollars, have failed to apply, the war department has informed Colonel O'Neil. Another group of 40,000 veterans have neglected to return applications with them for correction. To date more than 2,100,000 applications have been sent them for correction.

Local veterans or relatives of deceased soldiers who wish the information center will be given every assistance in completing their applications and interpreting the regulations governing their cases. Blank address envelopes and detailed instructions will be available. Finger printing facilities with an operator in attendance have been installed.

### BUILD GARDEN CITIES

STOCKHOLM—Room for more than 700 cottages will be available in each of two garden cities to be erected on land owned by the city of Stockholm. The city will spend about \$200,000 in preparing the tracts, one at Olovlund, six miles north of Stockholm, and the other at Skarpneck, about the same distance south.

### Taylor Suspended By New York A. C.

NEW YORK, Nov. 30 (AP)—Bud Taylor of Terre Haute, Ind., generally recognized as world's heaviest weight champion was suspended indefinitely here by the New York state athletic commission for withdrawing from a scheduled fight next Thursday with Tony Caronetti. Taylor reported an injured hand, but suspension in such cases is required by the commission's rules regardless of the circumstances. Taylor has been replaced by Ignacio Fernandez as an opponent for Caronetti.

### Florida Gets Farrell for Winter

Johnny Farrell, who won six open tournaments in less than a month this year, is going to spend the winter in Florida. He has accepted a "pro" position in St. Augustine, Fla. Farrell probably will represent his club in the winter tournaments in Dixie.
