Confused Price Movements Mark Street Trading

NEW YORK, Dec. 1 (AP)—Confused price movements characterized today's stock market, which was featured by the strength of the railroad shares. The ticker again fell 15 minutes behind the market by early afternoon.

Publication of the Ford price list, which is reported to be from \$100 to nearly \$200 below corresponding models of its chief competitor, brought some fresh selling into General Motors, but offerings were fairly well absorbed. Dodge Brothers and Hudson also were subjected to pressure, but Nash and Hupp recorded substantial gains.

Profit-taking brought about sharp recessions in Montgomery Ward, Radio Corporation and National Biscuit, all of which have been features in the recent advance. On the other hand, International Nickel, Postum and Westinghouse Electric started a new forward movement, selling 2 to 3 points higher. U. S. Steel continued was in rather free supply, but held within a point or so of last night's close.

FIGHTER ASHORE
