Wheat Advances Slightly Today
CHICAGO, Dec. 7 (AP)—Wheat started at 4 to 1/2 c advance and subsequently hardened a little more. Corn opened at 3/4 c to 1/2 c gain, but then reacted somewhat. Oats were firmer. Provisions held about steady.

Wheat closed unsettled at a shade to 1/2 c net gain; corn 1/2 to 3/4 c up; oats showing 3/4 c to 1/2 c advance and provisions unchanged to 2 1/2 c down.

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ISSUES SLUMP IN MORNING TRADING

Sharp Recessions in Wall Street on Heels of Coolidge's Statement

NEW YORK, Dec. 7 (AP)—Sharp recessions in many of the important issues ranging from \$1 to \$4 or more a share occurred at the opening of the stock market today. The selling was attributed to the market's reaction to President Coolidge's reiteration of his intention not to be a candidate next year, and perhaps to some fears that shipment of one million dollars in gold to England might be followed by other transfers and lead to higher interest rates.

The selling movements showed signs of expiring before the end of the first hour. Goodrich Rubber, which had been among the stocks showing early weakness, recovered rapidly and sold at a new high for the year, and there was confident buying of Montgomery Ward, Simmons, Atchison and Texas Gulf Sulphur.

In the first half hour's reaction, U. S. Steel and General Motors and other leaders had sustained losses averaging between 1 and 1 1/2 a share. Canadian Pacific dropped back about \$2 and Mullins Body more than \$4 a share.

Steel shares were liquidated rather freely. Midland Steel Products preferred broke 12 points, U. S. Steel common sold down 3 to 141, and losses of a point or more took place in the others.

Dupont sold off 4 1/2 points and numerous other high priced industrial shares, including Case Threshing, International Harvester, Radio, Greene Cananea Copper, American Machine and Foundry and Radio sold down 3 to 5 1/2 points. General Motors dropped 2 1/2 by early afternoon.

Rails yielded with the industrials with the sharpest breaks in Atlantic Coast Line, Lehigh Valley and Canadian Pacific, all 4 to 5 points.

The closing was weak. American Machine and Foundry broke 11 and Houston Oil 9 points.

Total sales approximated 2,500,000 shares.
